Focus of visit:

redacted (Moderators) looked at a sample of recent scripts from each class.

The scripts were moderated against the Island level descriptors and the scripts and judgements were discussed with the Literacy Co-ordinator and Headteacher.

Meeting with Head/Literacy Co-ordinator to establish school context

The school is currently focusing on improving reading with an awareness that this will have an impact on writing standards. Whilst writing is currently not on the SIP, and is not planned as a focus in the near future, the school has recently established within school moderation systems to improve staff confidence with levelling. The school has started to build up files of exemplified assessments to support internal moderation. Recent moderation has taken place and leadership is aware of next steps. The school uses the Island level descriptors for assessment.

Supporting evidence – A range of cross-curricular writing – Moderators agree L5c

Overall level agreed 5c.

Child D Year 6

Substantial piece Wonder Precepts Teacher assessment: 5c. Moderators: Agreed level 5c

Supporting evidence – Explanation text - Dynasties, Independent auto biography, Culture and Identity Moderators agree L5c

Overall level agreed at 2b.

General Commentary

- √ All levels were accurate
- √ High expectations across the whole school in writing
- $\sqrt{}$ Good evidence of positive marking peer and self-assessment.
- $\sqrt{\ }$ Clear, consistent marking using Green for Growth and Tickled Pink.
- √ Evidence of constructive feedback being given to improve work (Steps to Success). This was consistent across the whole school and the children use and understand the process well.
