Notes

- 1) Tests are normally conducted in Douglas but tests on tractors, invalid carriages, motor assisted cycles and engineering plant may be conducted at other places.
- 2) You are advised to circle the largest number of days or parts of days as the less you circle as convenient the greater will be the possibility of a delayed testing date. If, however, there are any dates when you will not be available to take (for example holiday or business absences) or, if you will not be ready to take the test before a certain date you should give this information where asked). This will avoid the possibility of an unsuitable appointment.
- 3) You must supply a suitable vehicle. The following are examples of type of vehicle
Private Motor car, Motor Cycle, Moped, Motor Cycle Combination, Van, Lorry under 3 tons unladen, Road Roller, Trolley bus, Laying Tractor, invalid Carriage, agricultural tractor, Mowing Machine, Vehicle controlled by Pedestrian, Motor Tricycle, Vehicle propelled by Electrical Power.

Candidates who are successful in passing the driving test in a heavy good vehicle will:

- a. If the test is taken on an articulated vehicle, be deemed to be competent to drive all types of heavy goods vehicles.
- b. If the test is taken on a rigid vehicle, be only deemed to be competent to drive heavy goods vehicles of that construction type.

Note: The foregoing is without prejudice to the ability of the Road Traffic Commissioners to require further proof of competence from a person wishing to obtain the grant of a licence to drive a public service vehicle.

Details of Driving Test

The Regulations require an applicant for a driving licence to satisfy the Examiner:

- a. That he/she/they is fully conversant with the contents of the Highway Code
- b. Generally that he/she/they is competent to drive without danger and with due consideration for other users on the road, a vehicle of the same class or description which he/she/they is tested. In addition, the candidate must fulfil a selection of the following requirements prescribed in relation to the Group of vehicles which comprise the one on which the test is taken

Additional Requirements for Driving Tests—Schedule 2

The additional requirements as to certain of which person taking a test must satisfy the person conducting the test in accordance with regulation 5 and Schedule 1 are his/her/their ability to do the following:

- 1) Read in good daylight (with the aid of glasses or contact lenses if worn) a registration plate containing letters and figures 79.4mm high at a distance of -
 - a) 20.5m in any case except that mentioned below; or
 - b) 12.3m in the case of a driving test carried out on a vehicle of a class included in group 7 only.
- 2) Start the engine of the vehicle.
- 3) Move away straight ahead or at an angle.
- 4) Overtake, meet or cross the path of other vehicles and take an appropriate course.
- 5) Turn right-hand and left-hand corners correctly.
- 6) Stop the vehicle in an emergency and normally and in the latter case bring it to rest at an appropriate part of the road.
- 7) Carry out manoeuvres involving the use of reverse gear.
- 8) Indicate his/her/their intended actions at appropriate times by giving signals in a clear and unmistakable manner; except that in the case of a vehicle with a left-hand drive or of a disabled driver for whom it is impracticable or undesirable to give signals by arm. There shall be no requirement to give signals which cannot be given by mechanical means.
- 9) Act correctly and promptly on all signals given by traffic signs and traffic controllers and take appropriate action on signs given by other road users.
- 10) Drive the vehicle backwards and promptly and cause it to face the opposite direction by means of its tracks.
- 11) Park the vehicle in a limited space.

Penalty

An applicant who, for the purpose of obtaining a licence knowingly makes any false statements is liable to a fine of up to £1,000.
