Payment Methods

Please make cheques payable to Isle of Man Post Office. All postal applications must be made by cheque or postal order and not cash. Payment at the counters can be made using: Cheque, Cash, Debit Cards or Postal orders.

Dishonoured Cheques

If a cheque for a licence is dishonoured, the licence will be void from the date of issue and the vehicle will become unlicensed.

Identity Requirements

If you acquire a vehicle without a registration document, the Licensing Office will write to the current registered keeper and they will be allowed 14 days in which to respond. Once a response is received confirming the vehicle is no longer of interest to them a Registration Certificate can be issued. If no response is received after the 14 days period a Registration Certificate will be issued.

If you are aware you are not the registered keeper then a change of ownership form should be submitted with this application.

You may also be required to provide proof of entitlement before the Certificate can be issued.
