



Why?

- Traceability for food and animal health
- EU rules compliance
- Continuation of export trade live and meat including UK






What is it?

Extension of previous requirements to include:

- Electronic Identification of slaughter lambs (EID)
- Movement reporting
- Central database






Softening the Impact

- Minimising requirements for paper
- Use of Critical Control Points to report Movements through them
- Providing access to on-line system



How: Meat Plant?

- Slaughter Lambs under 12 months of age
 going direct from flock
 of birth to meat plant.
 Single purple EID tag
- Purchased by owner directly from Shearwell
- Other sheep: yellow
 EID & secondary tag





Farm to Farm Movements

- Report movement details: origin and destination
 - EITHER On-Line
 - OR by paper

- Flock number
- Sheep/Goats
- Quantity, Animal details
- Departure date
- Arrival date



How: Imports?

- Notify Movement
 EITHER
- On-LineOR
- Completion of UK
 Movement document


 and send to ScotEID





How: Exports?


 Information provided by Exporter for Export Health Certificate will be used by DEFA to update database





How to Access Web

- Log on for Isle of Man users
- Information needed: species, head count, flock number, name, address, e-mail
- Scoteid (Log on details will be sent to registered flock and herd keepers



How to: Paper work

- Non-web movement reporting will be by use of Movement Reporting Documents
- Single form: Departure and arrival Keeper
- Completed forms need to be sent to ScotEID
- Blank movement reporting documents will be made available





When is it starting?

Phased start:

- Slaughter lamb EID tagging requirements by 23rd May 2016
- Login instructions, Movement reporting forms and Guidance notes sent out by 24th May
- Full Movement reporting 31st May 2016




Do's and Don'ts

- Do order your own slaughter tags
- Do continue to keep records either electronically or on paper
- Don't use more than 1 EID tag per animal
- Don't forget to use the right taggers



Summary

- Electronic tagging extended to include slaughter lambs
- Requirement to report movements either by Web or paper
- Critical Control Points
 (NMP & Mart) will report
 movements directly
- Starts by 31st May 2016
