THE IMMIGRATION (PORTS OF ENTRY) (ISLE OF MAN)

ORDER, 1972.

I, the said Lieutenant Governor, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 33(3) of the Immigration Act 1971 (an Act of Parliament) as extended to the Isle of Man by Order in Council, DO hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Ports of Entry) (Isle of Man) Order 1972 and shall come into operation on 1st January, 1973.
2. The ports specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be ports of entry for the purposes of the Immigration Act 1971 (an Act of Parliament) as extended to the Isle of Man by Order in Council.

SCHEDULE

PORTS OF ENTRY

Seaports

- (a) the port of Douglas;
- (b) the port of Ramsey;
- (c) whenever it is impracticable for the ports of Douglas and Ramsey to be used owing to stress of weather or other cause, the port of Peel.

Airports

- (a) Ronaldsway Airport;
- (b) whenever it is impracticable for Ronaldsway Airport to be used owing to stress of weather or other cause, Jurby Airport.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order designates the ports specified in the Schedule to the Order as ports of entry for the purposes of the Immigration Act 1971, as extended to the Isle of Man. Under paragraph 26 of Schedule 2 to the Act, the owners or agents of a ship or aircraft employed to carry passengers for reward are prohibited from arranging, without the approval of the Lieutenant Governor for the ship or aircraft to call at a port in the Isle of Man other than a port of entry for the purpose of disembarking passengers, if any of them may not enter the Isle of Man without leave, and have not been given leave, or for the purposes of embarking passengers unless the owners or agents have reasonable cause to believe all of them to be patrial. An owner or agent who contravenes the provisions of paragraph 26 commits an offence under section 27 of the Act.
