



Voting... things to consider



Am I registered to vote?

What is the deadline for registering to vote?

To vote in the 2021 House of Keys General Election you must be registered by **Thursday 2 September 2021.**



What constituency am I eligible to vote in?

Use the mapping service at www.gov.im/maps/ to find out what constituency you live in.



How do I find out who is standing for election in my constituency?

Candidates will publicly declare their intentions to stand, often via the local media. A Notice of Poll – listing the names of all the candidates standing in the 12 constituencies – will be published in a local newspaper and on the Government website approximately one month before Election Day.



How do I learn more about the candidates and what they stand for?

- · Read the candidate manifestos
- Attend a pre-election meeting
- Follow election coverage in local media
- Follow the candidates on social media
- Ask questions when candidates visit your home



Do I know how to cast my vote?

The Guidance for Voters document at www.gov.im/elections provides step-by-step advice on voting at a polling station, in advance by post, and via a proxy.



Will you be in the Island on polling day – **Thursday 23 September 2021**?

Do you intend to vote in person at your allotted polling station?

Can you make it to the polling station between **8am** and **8pm**?

Will you need – or would you prefer – to apply for a postal voting pack?

Do you need to appoint a proxy to vote on your behalf?



How do I find out the location of my polling station?

Polling station addresses will be listed in the Notice of Poll and on the Government website. Approximately one week before Election Day, you will receive a poll card providing the location of the polling station where you can vote in person.



Do I need my poll card in order to vote?

No – but you must be on the electoral register.
