Schedule 2 The Protected Buildings Register

Notifications of entries on register etc.

- 2 (1) As soon as may be (practical) after a building has been entered in the register, or the register has been amended by removal of a building from it, the Department shall serve a notice on the owner and the occupier of the building stating that it has been entered in or removed from the register.
 - (2) The owner or the occupier of, and any other person having an interest in, a building which has been entered in the register may apply to the Department to remove the building from the register-
 - (a) within the prescribed period after service on him of a notice under sub-paragraph (1);
 - (b) after the expiration of the prescribed period after the decision of the Department on a previous request under subsection in relation to the building.

Under the Town and Country Planning (Registered Buildings) Regulations 2013

5. Periods for purpose of Schedule 2 paragraph 2(2)

- (1) The period specified for the purposes of paragraph 2(2)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Act (period after notice of registration, within which owner or occupier may request de-registration) is 21 days.
- (2) The period specified for the purposes of paragraph 2(2)(b) of Schedule 2 to the Act (period after initial period, during which owner or occupier may not request a de-registration) is 5 years.

Register entry description

History

Designed by Charles and David Stevenson, the lighthouse became operational on 15 April 1914.

The fog signal, constructed at the same time as the lighthouse, was deactivated in 1987.

The light was automation in 1993. The former keeper's cottages on the headland above have since been sold.

Details

MATERIALS: Painted masonry tower with metal framed lantern room. Glazing to lantern room. Lower and higher terraces have metal guardings. Internally, metal staircases link concrete landings. External walls are finished internally in white glazed ceramic tiles.

PLAN: Cylindrical tower with very slight taper; terrace at base, including housing for former

fog horn. Terrace/balcony at top of masonry tower below lantern room.

EXTERIOR: Painted masonry tower with feature surrounds to openings. Upper and lower terraces have metal balustrades. Lantern room constructed in metal, with glazing framed in a lattice pattern. Whilst the lantern room has 360 degree glazing, the landward, westerly, facing portion of the glazing is painted black to provide light protection to the former keeper's cottage.

INTERIOR: Spiral stair of 87 steps giving maintenance access to lantern room. As living accommodation for lighthouse keeper was provided in a separate building further up the headland (connected to the lighthouse by an external stairway of 127 steps), the lighthouse tower itself contains no domestic accommodation. Landings are linked by painted metal staircases, with brass capping/trim to openings.

Subsidiary Features: The 1st order Fresnel lens and associated equipment, supplied when constructed, is still in place, although modern equipment is now used to produce the tower's main light.

Reason for Registration Decision

Maughold Lighthouse Tower is recommended for entry into the Protected Buildings Register for the following reasons:

•ARCHITECTURAL INTEREST:

Designed by brothers Charles and David Stevenson, the building is a surviving intact example of early 20th century maritime engineering.

•HISTORIC INTEREST:

Functioning lighthouse dating from early 20th century used to prevent shipping accidents, illustrating important aspects of the island's social and economic history.
