

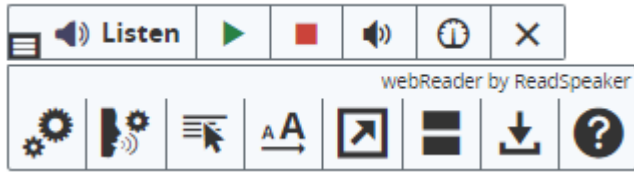

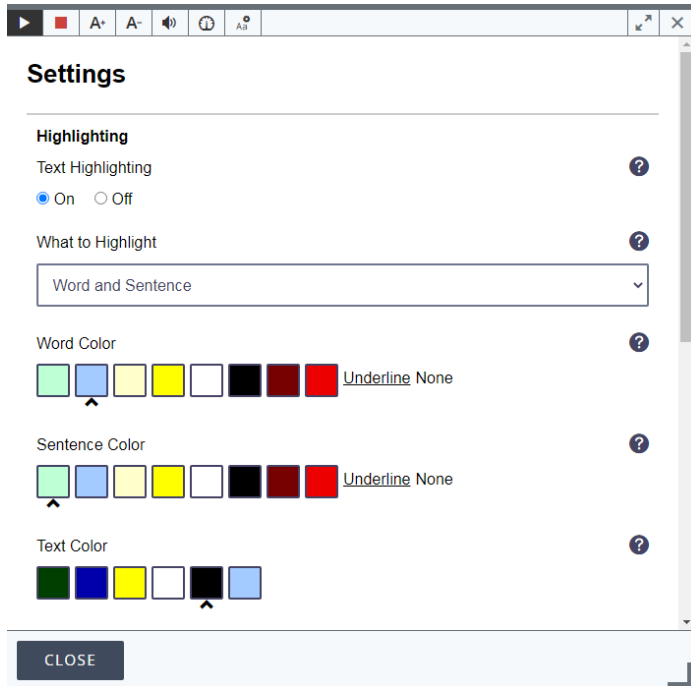

From the general settings menu, click the cog icon which will allow you to change the highlighting settings (including colour and how much is highlighted), and automatic scrolling options.

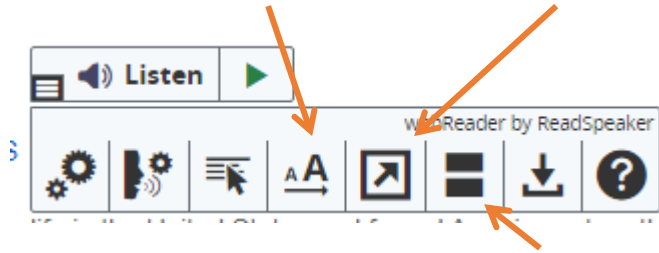


The face and cog icon allows you to change the accent used.
