Introduction

The Quarterly Statistical Report draws data and indicators relating to the performance of the Isle of Man economy together from a range of sources across and outside the Isle of Man Government.

Prior to 2020, the need for such a report was met by the then Economic Affairs Division's Quarterly Economic and Statistical Report. Publication of that report was temporarily discontinued during the COVID-19 pandemic due to much of the material produced in the report being made available via the Government's Economic Recovery Group dashboard. As that source of data is now no longer in operation, and in response to requests from members of the public and the Isle of Man Government, Statistics Isle of Man has made the decision to launch the Quarterly Statistical Report to perform a role similar to that of the Quarterly Economic and Statistical Report.

The Quarterly Statistical Report is currently under development. At present it borrows heavily from the Quarterly Economic and Statistical Report in structure and content. Statistics Isle of Man will be reviewing its content in order to enhance and improve the report's coverage and improve its usefulness to both Government and the public.

Key Points

This report provides the latest available information as at 31 December 2022. Some of the key points from the report are as follows:

- The number of people in employment was 36,107, whilst that of those in selfemployment was 8,066.
- Inflation for the 12 months to December 2022 was 7.4% as measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI). This is lower than the previous high of 10.8% in July 2022 and shows inflation slowing compared to the increases over the first half of the year.
- The number of people registered as unemployed was 292, which is slightly above the 12-month average level of unemployment of 288. As with the number of employed people, this represents a return to pre-COVID-19 levels, with registered unemployment in Q4 2022 actually being less than at any stage in 2019.
- There were 285 full time job vacancies and 197 part time job vacancies available at the end of December 2022. The same figures for December 2021 were 278 full-time positions and 182 part time positions.
- The average house price at the end of December 2022 was £388,582, which is up slightly from the September 2022 average of £382,578, and has increased 7.2% since the same time last year.
- 343 new work permits and 103 renewals were issued in the three months to
 December 2022. It should be noted however that work permits will be impacted
 when exemptions to certain jobs or sectors are applied or removed. 235 new national
 insurance numbers were issued to foreign nationals, which includes anyone outside
 of the United Kingdom.
- There was a total of 797 ships registered on the Isle of Man with a total registered tonnage of 12.4 million tonnes. The number of registered ships has decreased by 79 since December 2021.
- The total deposit base was £39.57bn as at 30 September 2022, which is the latest available data, and this is down from £40.23bn at the end of June 2022.
- Funds under Management amounted to \$12.55bn as at 30 September 2022, which is the latest available data, and this is down from \$14.86bn at the end of June 2022.






Equities - FTSE 100






Bank of England Base Rate Projection



Employment




The employment estimate is based on the latest Income Tax records.

Inflation




Inflation as at December 2022 stands at 7.4% for CPI and 9.7% for RPI.






Isle of Man Property Market – Prices compared to 12 months ago



For the 12 months to December 2022, the average house price was £388,582, a flat was £189,625 and the weighted property price was £349,710. The weighted property price is a weight average of house and flat prices based on transaction volumes.

Isle of Man Property Market – Property Transactions




For the 12 months to December 2022, 1,218 houses and 357 flats were sold.

All property market data is based on the latest available data from the Land Registry. There is a time lag in transactions being registered with the Land Registry, which is reflected by the difference shown between the first estimate, which is taken at the end of the applicable quarter and the later estimates which include transactions which were not lodged until after the first estimate was produced. Data is revised for up to 12 months after the first estimate has been published, after which point the data is considered final.






Planning Approvals and Building Control

12 Month Rolling Average Electricity Consumption (Units Consumed '000s)




For the three months to December 2022, 36.1 million units of electricity were consumed domestically and 46.4 million were consumed for non-domestic purposes.





Benefits and Financial Support




In December 2022, 2,284 people claimed Income Support, 805 people claimed Short Term Incapacity benefit, 1,809 people claimed Long Term Incapacity benefit and 1,004 people claimed Employed Person's Allowance.

All benefits, with the exception of Income Support, saw an increase in the number of claimants compared to the same period last year, December 2021.



Registered Tonnage




As at December 2022, there were 797 ships registered on the Isle of Man, and the registered tonnage during the quarter to the end of December 2022 was 12.35 million tonnes.






Change in Labour Market compared with 12 months ago



Size of the Labour Market





Unemployment








Quarterly Changes in Employment by Sector




Annual Changes in Employment by Sector for Seasonal Industries








Job Vacancies






The total funds under management as at September 2022 is \$12.55 billion.




Financial Services Act 2008 Licence Holders

New Company Formation




During the quarter to December 2022, 183 1931 Act companies were formed, 187 2006 Act Companies were formed and 17 companies converted to 2006 Act Companies.




Total Registered Companies
