Legal Aid Appeal Tribunal (LAAT) (see 56/22 CC (a) (i)) – a redacted copy of the Tribunal's judgment was circulated to the Legal Aid Committee prior to the meeting. The LAAT Chair has determined that the Tribunal does have the power to review the financial aspect of appeals against the award of Legal Aid. Concerns were expressed by several LAC members as potentially this could be used tactically by - particularly controlling and coercive -opponents to delay proceedings. CC was asked to identify where regulatory amendment was required so that the LAC can consider and make necessary representation to Treasury/Tynwald in order that Regulations can be updated. CC advised that the HM Attorney's General's Legal Aid Review was currently being considered by the Justice Sub-Committee. The next step will be a paper for the Council of Minister's and subsequently Tynwald's consideration before any recommendations can be implemented. The Committee noted that they were in a difficult position in terms of the Law Society's perceived lack of progress and further noted that the matter was out with the gift of the Committee at the present time, CC said that only Treasury can agree to an increase of the hourly rates of Advocates and the Treasury Minister has corresponded with the Law Society on this matter. 25/23 ATTENDANCE POLICY The Legal Aid Attendance Policy was approved and signed off by the Chairman. 26/23 **ANY OTHER BUSINESS** HC gave (potential) apologies for the next meeting which is due to take place on Wednesday 9th August at 14:00.
