Trade in Animals and Related Products Order 2020

TRADE IN ANIMALS AND RELATED PRODUCTS DECLARATION OF SPECIAL MEASURES (GREECE)

Made: 09 November 2023
Coming into Operation: 10 November 2023

The Department of Environment, Food and Agriculture has reasonable grounds for suspecting the existence of sheep pox and goat pox in Greece, such that certain animal by-products originating in or dispatched from Greece are liable to pose risk to human or animal health.

The Department of Environment, Food and Agriculture makes the following Declaration under article 18(1) of the Trade in Animals and Related Products Order 2020¹ and declares the following special measures to be necessary in the Isle of Man in order to contain the risk to human or animal health.

1 Title

This Declaration is the Trade in Animals and Related Products Declaration of Special Measures (Greece).

2 Commencement

This Declaration comes into operation on 10 November 2023.

3 Suspension of entry into the Isle of Man

- (1) Entry into the Island is suspended for untreated hides and skins of ovine and caprine animals originating in or dispatched from Greece.
- (2) In paragraph (1), “untreated hides and skins” has the same meaning as in Annex I to Commission Regulation (EU) No 142/2011².
