As an agent you will be able to undertake activities such as rendering VAT returns, update your client's details and view balances on the account. As an agent you also have authority to deal with all Customs & Excise matters, e.g. over the phone, by email or in person.

NOTE: This form registers you as an agent only. Customs & Excise will need a separate VAT AG2 MAN for each client you intend to act on behalf of. That form **must** be signed by the client.
