

description

This pair of thatched cottages has been formed into one dwelling parallel to the road. The whitewashed stone walls are buttressed on the road facade (possibly to prevent deterioration through traffic vibration). In spite of this the authentic atmosphere is still maintained in the character of the structure and the Ayre rush thatch. Two chimneys (separate) project through the center and north gable ridge respectively and the window and door rectangular openings have been retained in their original locations although the fittings are new.

No interior inspection has been performed.

The state of repair seems to be very good.

recommendation

As previously mentioned this cottage is within a hundred yards of another of similar type. For the reasons stated in that context it is suggested that both be listed for preservation.

Reasons for Registration

Bridge Cottage, Bride, is included in the Protected Buildings Register for the following reasons:

ARCHITECTURAL INTEREST:

- A surviving example of a vernacular thatched cottage likely to date from the early 19th century or late 18th century, with various elements of historic fabric and detailing.

HISTORIC INTEREST:

- A surviving example of a vernacular thatched cottage in a rural setting; illustrating important aspects of the nation's social and cultural history.
