Application to pay voluntary contributions

Your eligibility to pay voluntary contributions will be assessed with your application and you will be issued a letter confirming what contributions you are eligible to pay.

Please note that in accordance with the Social Security (Reciprocal Agreement)(Isle of Man) Order 2016 you cannot pay voluntary contributions in both the UK and the IOM for the same tax year.

Class 3 contributions can help you to qualify for some benefits in the future if you do not have enough other contributions.

Voluntary contributions count toward

- Manx State Pension
- Pension Supplement entitlement

They do not count toward

- Contribution based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Bereavement Support Payment
- Incapacity Benefit
- Maternity Allowance
