FOREWORD

I am delighted to present this annual report highlighting the work of the Isle of Man Public Record Office for 2022-2023.

As the Island's national archives, the Public Record Office collects, preserves and provides public access to the historic records of our government, schools, courts, local authorities, and a variety of other public bodies.

Archives are for everyone, and this year our social media platforms, open days and events engaged over 2000 customers with the Island's history. Our reading room and enquiry services allowed customers to use the archive collections for research into a diverse range of subjects.

We acquired and preserved over 20 cubic metres of new archive collections, including maps, plans, minutes and photographs. Our plans for digital preservation of archive collections moved forward rapidly, and we looked to the future with the publication of our Forward Plan for the next 5 years.

Our mission

The Isle of Man Public Record
Office preserves the national
archives of Isle of Man public
bodies. Our role and activities are
defined by statute – the Public
Records Act 1999 and the Public
Records Order 2015.

Records of Isle of Man public bodies that have historic significance are identified, preserved and made accessible for all who wish to use them, whilst complying with legislation relating to privacy and sensitive data.

Our work includes the selection and transfer of records to the archives, conservation and collections care, cataloguing, access and outreach.

New accessions

The Public Record Office regularly receives new transfers of records from Isle of Man Government and local authorities.

Records that are suitable for preservation as part of the national archives collections are typically transferred to us when they reach 25 years old. These new collections are known as 'accessions'.

During 2022-23, we received 33 new accessions of archive records, totalling 22.64 cubic metres (the equivalent of approximately 453 large boxes).

COLLECTION highlights

Isle of Man Tourist Board (A268)


In December 2022, we received 17 albums of photographs containing images from the Isle of Man Tourist Board dating from 1936-1964.

The photographs contain images submitted as entries for annual photography competitions, advertising, and visits of travel agents to the Isle of Man. The albums are available to view in our reading room and provide a wonderful insight into the marketing of the Isle of Man as a holiday destination.

Annual photography competition entries provide a unique record of the Isle of Man as seen through the eyes of holiday visitors, rather than professional photographers.

Architect's maps and plans (A243 and A255)


A new collection of 2135 drawings, maps and plans from the Isle of Man Government's Department of Infrastructure and its predecessors. Dating from 1904 onwards, the records include plans of heritage buildings, public buildings, Ronaldsway airport and HM Prison on Victoria Road, Douglas.



Customs and Excise: register of brewing (A264)

Dating from 1874-1910, this register records occupiers and locations of buildings on the Isle of Man used for brewing or storing malt and sugar for brewing in the late 19th and early 20th century.

The register records premises to be inspected under the Brewers Act 1874, which aimed to ensure the purity of beer brewed on the Isle of Man.



Consignments

Some records within the Public Record Office stores are held as consignments under section 3(8) of the Public Records Act 1999.

These records remain in formal ownership of the creating public body and are not yet part of the national archives collections.

During 2022-23, we continued our work to undertake assessment of these consignments. 22 consignments, totaling 6.4 cubic metres (128 large boxes) were assessed by the Public Record Office team.

The selected records (those to be kept permanently) were fully transferred to the Public Record Office to improve preservation and public access.

NEW CATALOGUES

Michael Commissioners 1800-2000 (S133)

Containing records from Michael Parish Commissioners 1896-1992, Michael Village Commissioners 1905-1989, and Michael District Commissioners from 1989 onwards.

The collection provides a unique record of the history of Michael parish and the village of Kirk Michael from the late 19th century through to the end of the 20th century.

Available records include minute books, property valuation lists, reports, and records of events, including royal visits.

A licence register dated 1939-1942 gives a snapshot of the organisation of food rationing in the village of Kirk Michael during the Second World War.

Ramsey Town Commissioners 1865-1966 (S136-138)

Ramsey Town Commissioners records held at the Record Office date back to the establishment of the Commissioners in 1865.



Records of Ramsey Commissioners include:

- · Board minutes from 1865-1946;
- · Property rate books for 1865-1956;
- · An original tender and specification for the Ramsey swing bridge, dated 1888;
- · Committee minutes from 1882-1966, relating to lighting, sewers, parks, the fire brigade, health and many other matters.

We expect to receive more records from Ramsey Commissioners during 2023-2024, so please ask a member of staff if the records you wish to see are not listed in the catalogue.



Preservation

The Public Record Office operates a continuous programme of measures to improve care of our collections.

Our archive stores are kept between 13-18 C and between 45-55% humidity to avoid extremes of temperature or moisture damaging the collections.

Records are examined, cleaned where possible and necessary, and repackaged into specialist boxes or other packaging to best ensure their preservation.


Metalwork such as rusty paperclips, staples and fastenings are removed, as corrosion of the metal causes holes and discolouration in paper records.

COLLECTIONS care

Douglas Borough Council: maps and plans

This year, our Records Assistants have been working hard to list, label and package a collection of 200 rolls of maps and plans we received from Douglas Borough Council in 2017 (A99). So far, they have examined and listed over 2000 individual plans.

The plans include this beautiful plan of Douglas from July 1930 showing places of worship, places of entertainment, bus routes, sports grounds and principal roads.



Microfilm preservation

Our Record Assistant Robyn has established a monitoring programme for our microfilm holdings to assess deterioration of the film. Test strips are used to measure levels of acid vapour being released as the film's degrade. The strips change colour as acid vapour is detected allowing monitoring of the condition of the microfilms over time.

We are pleased to report that at this time very few films are showing significant deterioration.

Many of our microfilm and fiche resources have also been rehoused this year into acid free packaging to help protect them from degradation.

Digital Preservation

One of the greatest challenges facing modern archive services is the preservation of 'born digital' archive material.

From the mid-1980s, government began producing records digitally. These digital records are vulnerable - to the rapid pace of technology change, to 'bit rot', obsolescence of formats, software and storage media, and to accidental or deliberate alteration or deletion.

How do we preserve these records as archives for future generations?

Since 2020, the Public Record Office has been undertaking a major project to establish a digital preservation solution.

GOING DIGITAL

Preserving our 'born digital' heritage

In April 2022, we began a procurement exercise to select a supplier for the provision of digital preservation software and storage. After a full evaluation exercise, we awarded the contract to Preservica, a market leader in the supply of archival digital preservation solutions.

We are in the final stages of implementing the software and cloud storage, which will form the core of the Public Record Office 'digital archive'.

Our new 'digital archive' will allow us to begin accepting new deposits of digital records from Isle of Man public bodies, and to carry out preservation actions to ensure these records survive as part of the national archive collections.

Access to our 'born digital' archives will be provided through an online service, which will allow keyword and advanced searching across our catalogues for both paper and digital records. It will then be possible to view selected digital records online. We hope to launch this service in early 2024.



Social media

Social media continues to be a key part of our outreach strategy.

Facebook and Twitter help us to connect with customers online, and share stories and content from the national archives collections with a global audience.

Our Twitter posts achieved an average of 6717 impressions per month, and an average of 338 engagements per month. Our tweets were 'liked' 1209 times over the course of the year.

On Facebook, we saw our 'total reach' increase substantially during 2022-23, with our posts entering the screens of an average of 9403 unique users per month.

We received an average of 516 Facebook engagements (user clicks) on our posts per month, and an average of 180 reactions (likes or other reactions) to our posts per month.

OUTREACH

Heritage Open Days

In September 2022, we opened our store doors again for the annual heritage open days, conducting 5 behind the scenes tours for members of the public.

Our drop-in exhibition, held over 3 days, celebrated community spirit and community events in the Isle of Man. Items on display showcased enjoyment and entertainment in many forms — from carnivals to sporting events, village fairs to royal visits.

Talks and group visits

This year our Outreach and Archives Officer was delighted to be invited to deliver talks to Laxey and Lonan Heritage Trust, the 'Breathe Easy' group and Rushen Heritage Trust.

We also welcomed a number of community groups to Unit 40A Spring Valley for behind the scenes tours of the national archives.

Groups visiting us included Port St Mary Women's Institute, the 'Bumblebees', Rushen Rotary Club, students from the University College history and heritage course, Southern Befrienders and volunteers from the Isle of Man Family History Society library.

The Record Office also took part in the Isle of Man Government Conference and the University College Isle of Man Research festival.

Our 5- year vision for the Isle of Man Public Record Office is:


- ☐ To be a centre for excellence, benchmarking our service against professional standards.
