The activity ran from 23/05/2023 to 28/07/2023.






































Would you find it more convenient to vote at any of the polling stations within your constituency if this option was made available?

Would you find it convenient to vote at any polling station on the island if this option was made available?





Select one - Preferred method to receive campaign materials from candidates








Did you attend a pre-election meeting within the constituency in which you voted?
