Warehouse could be over 400 years old

THE old warehouse behind St. Mary's on the seaward side of Castletown Square, which has had a derelict appearance for years and is now a source of some embarrassment, for the Commissioners, may soon look more cared-for if estimates for cosmetic work to the exterior are not too high for the Commissioners' pocket.

The building was the subject of a notice of motion by Mr Tony O'Sullivan at this month's meeting. He wants to see guttering and perhaps whitepainted shutters on the windows of the warehouse.


