CHANGE OF CONTROLLER

From Monday 3 October 2022 the Treasury (a Department of the Isle of Man Government) (Treasury) assumes responsibility for procurement services for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, the Council of Ministers, Government Departments, Statutory Boards (excluding the Manx Utilities Authority and the IOM Post Office) and Offices.

This notice is to inform all those persons who have registered as users on the <u>Isle of Man Government Procurement Portal</u> (including those whose information has been collected on behalf of an organisation).

To enable the change in delivery of procurement services, the Attorney General's Chambers will transfer information and personal data, collected through the Isle of Man Government Procurement Portal, to the Treasury to enable the Treasury Department to:

- meet its legal obligation to provide a public service and carry out statutory government functions which includes running and managing current and live procurement processes;
- meet any request you make for information or a service including a procurement process; and
- provide services to support the above which includes staff administration, accounts and records management

If any personal data and/or information is not required for the above processes, this information will be retained by the Attorney General's Chambers.

The Attorney General's Chambers retain a legal obligation to maintain records in the public interest. This includes the need to retain information for historical or archiving purposes about previously run procurements and to provide services to support the above, which includes archiving and retrieval of records to meet its own legal obligations.
