#### **Aim:**

To work with our partner agencies - and provide key workers for schools, youth clubs and other services in the area. We will make the West of the Island a safe place for our youth to flourish free from Anti-Social behaviour by and towards them. To help draw together our Youth and Elders within the community.

#### **Why?**

Young people can often appear to be separate and feel separated from our local community by perceptions within the community. The abuse of alcohol and introduction to misuse of drugs puts the children at risk. Individual youngsters can create high levels of crime and nuisance if they are not engaged with.

#### **How?**

Local Partnerships working to reduce anti-social behaviour through Operation Link. Identify and work to reduce the incidence of alcohol and drug supply to the youth as a priority. Continue strong links with the Queen Elizabeth II High School through Citizenship program and 'Safer Schools' project. Develop link between Primary and Secondary Schools build trust between children and the Police. Police Officers identified to work with persistent and difficult young offenders to change their behaviour. Work with off-licence premises and other outlets to reduce the supply of alcohol to young people.

#### **Aim:**

We will increase safety on the roads in our area.

#### **Why?**

Collisions have a huge impact on individuals and the wider community. We receive regular and repeated complaints about speeding. Road safety continues to be an important quality of life issue.

#### **How?**

We will focus on the principles of Enforcement, Education and being Pro-active:- Our road safety plan will deliver relevant, local, education based campaigns. We will run six Roads Policing Operations in the next year. We will run two large-scale enforcement and education based drink-driving campaigns in the coming year. Operation Aware (PC Flat) coupled with enforcement activity will raise awareness and reduce speeds on our roads. We will develop the ability to deploy Community Speed enforcers with Laser detection device through the area. All road policing activities will continue to focus on young and uninsured drivers.

#### **Aim:**

We will continue to increase our profile within the community. We will continue and develop our customer focus.

#### **Why?**

Here in the West our profile is one which is about the traditional Community Police Officer. People tell us that is what they want.

#### **How?**

We will continue our commitment to foot patrols. We will continue to be present at local events. We will endeavour to improve relationships between the elder and the youth population through Project Eden. Name in Every Neighbourhood and Copper with a Copper will continue to bring the Police and the public together. We will have a high profile within our community and meet with our stakeholders on a regular basis.

#### **Our pledge will guide the work that we do:**

- Keep Crime Low.
- Put our selves at times and in places that we should be.
- Work with our partners at local and government level.
- Police events.
- Keep victims informed and maintain our high standards.
