### **Clagh Vane Development**

The new £8.4 million development in Ballasalla is now near completion. Careful design of the site means that despite enhanced parking and green space, there are an additional 7 properties across the site, which includes a number of ground floor apartments and wheelchair access properties, plus 8 low energy homes.

The list for the third phase for allocation of the properties is being finalised.

### Shared Housing Waiting Lists—a resounding success!

Since 2016, we've been working in partnership with Local Authorities to run shared Housing Waiting Lists. These lists allow applicants applying for public sector housing to be considered for allocation by a range of local authorities, including the DOI, who all operate within a specific area. For example, applicants who qualify to live in the North of the Island previously had to apply to only one housing provider; by joining the shared list they can now be considered for allocation by Ramsey Town Commissioners & the Department of Infrastructure.

The shared lists have significantly reduced waiting times for applicants because there is a larger range of properties available to them. We hope that those who have been housed from the shared list are enjoying their new homes.

We currently have shared waiting lists operating for the Northern, Southern and Eastern areas of the Island and you can find out more about this on our website.

#### **Your Tenancy Agreement**

Please note that you must comply with the terms of your tenancy agreement if you don't want to risk losing your home. If you intend to make any adaptations or alterations to our housing stock, including our gardens and fencing, it is an obligation for you to contact us in writing or by email.

We are reasonable landlords and will work with you wherever possible, but please remember you must ask for written permission to make any alteration, either inside or outside of the property, to avoid breaching your Tenancy Agreement or possibly being recharged.

Turning down your heating by just 1° could save 10% on your fuel bill—the ideal temperature is between 18° and 21°

Set the heating to come on earlier and switch off later rather than turning the thermostat up

Don't waste warm water—fill up a sink or use a washing up bowl rather than a running tap

We are currently carrying out a survey to update our asbestos records. Older properties may contain asbestos in the fabric and finishes typically in older vinyl flooring, textured coatings and certain roofing materials. Although these items present a very low risk, they should not be disturbed.

Tenants are asked to contact the Customer Service team if they wish to carry out any building work other than basic decoration. More information on asbestos in older houses can be found on our website at www.gov.im

## **Condensation Prevention**

Condensation is a condition that affects many homes. The problem can lead to staining and mould growth damaging wallpaper, wall surfaces, window frames, furniture and clothing. All air contains a certain amount of 'invisible' water vapour. The higher the temperature of the air, the more water vapour it can hold. Areas particularly prone are:

- Kitchens and bathrooms
- Walls of unheated rooms
- Cold corners of rooms
- Wardrobes/cupboards and behind furniture against an outside wall

#### Tips to help prevent Condensation

- Don't dry washing on radiators
- When cooking put lids on saucepans, don't leave kettles boiling
- Keep the kitchen door closed and open a window when you cook
- If you use a tumble dryer, make sure the hose sends the air outside
- Keep the bathroom door closed when bathing/showering and open a window when finished; wipe down surfaces and close the bathroom door afterwards
- Open trickle vents in windows and keep a low background heat on during winter months
- You MUST NOT use portable paraffin or bottled gas heaters

If you do have a serious condensation problem, please contact the Housing Office on 685955 and we can arrange to carry out an inspection to see if the problem can be identified.

### **First Time Home Buyers Assistance**

Buying your first home is exciting, but it can also be quite a daunting prospect. The Housing Team at the Department of Infrastructure is here to help!

Every year we provide hundreds of thousands of pounds in loans to first time buyers helping to make buying your first home more affordable. During 2018/19, the Department provided nearly

 $\pounds$ 850,000 in Equity Loan assistance towards first time buyer home purchases through its Shared Equity Schemes.

The Department can directly offer first time buyer homes for sale in conjunction with developers who are required to include a certain amount of affordable housing in any residential development where there are 8 or more homes being constructed.

There are currently two upcoming residential developments which already have planning permission and which will include first time buyer homes at Auldyn Meadows, Ramsey and Reayrt Mie, Ballasalla. Several other sites are also currently going through the planning process.

As an initiative to help you to save up the deposit that you need to buy your first home, the Department has 5 homes in Cronk Cullyn, Colby which are rented out to eligible applicants at 20% less than the market rate.

In the future, the Department may seek to make a legislative Scheme for Mid Rent and provide homes all over the Island at a discount to allow for prospective 1st time buyers to save the deposit that they need.
