2024 02/04	ISLE OF MAN ENERGY	
	Responses in regard to various queries raised at the January meeting were noted.	
	Complaints being received by the OFT about billing issues had reduced to a minimum. There had been recent instances of duplication of Direct Debits, but these had been reasonably quickly resolved.	
	IOM Energy had been advised to update its 'Vulnerable Customer' criteria in light of The Vulnerability Order. It appeared that this was to be enforced by the police. It was noted that OFGEM had different criteria to the Order, but the Cabinet Office had been cognisant of this in its drafting. The criteria were to be circulated to Members.	JRP
	In regard to the calorific value of LPG, it had been explained that natural gas had a variable calorific range, whereas LPG didn't, as it was a manufactured product.	
	It had been queried why bottled cooking gas was so expensive. The production process and additional parties added to the cost. Bottled cooking gas was not covered by the CURA regulatory regime. The OFT had powers to investigate if price was of major public concern. It was not deemed to be such at present, but it was agreed to monitor and publish prices of bottled cooking gas.	JRP/ ZAM
	Mr Murphy was pleased that the pressure brought to bear by Government, including the huge contribution of the OFT, had seemed to achieve significant results for gas customers.
