Standard Conditions Relating to Skips

- 1. Each skip shall be positioned so that its longer sides are parallel to the edge of the carriageway and as near to the edge of the carriageway as possible, but in such a way that it does not impede the surface water drainage of the highway. Fire hydrants, manhole covers or the apparatus of any statutory undertaker must not be covered by the placing of any skip.
- 2. Where 2 or more skips are on the highway at any one location, they shall be placed as closely as possible to each other. Skips must not be left unattended in any single-track road or service lane where their presence restricts access by emergency services.
- 3. Skips shall be painted yellow and must have the name or address, and telephone number of the owner clearly marked on the sides. Each end of the skip shall carry a reflectorised strip having broad red fluorescent and yellow reflecting diagonal stripes in compliance with Builder's Skips (Markings) Regulations 1984. Each skip shall not exceed 5 metres in length or 2 metres in width.
- 4. During the hours or darkness amber warning lamps complying with the requirements of the Traffic Signs and General Directions 1994 shall be placed on each corner of the skip. If there are more than two skips in line, the lamping shall be the same on the approach but the skips only require lamps on the exposed end corners.
- 5. No skip when standing on the highway shall contain any inflammable, explosive, noxious or dangerous material or any material which is likely to putrefy, or likely to become a nuisance to users of the highway. No skip shall be overfilled so that contents spill or protrude onto the highway.

Notes:

- 1. Each skip must be removed within two days of being filled and in no case must remain longer that the permitted time stated overleaf.
- 2. The highway must be left clean and tidy on completion. (The Department will recharge for any cleaning or repair work necessary).
- 3. Compliance with these conditions does not absolve the owner of a skip from liability for any injury, damage or loss resulting from the presence on a highway of the skip.
- 4. The owner of a skip may be required by the Police or the Department to move or reposition a skip if it is found to present a hazard to traffic or a nuisance. Failure to comply with the conditions of this permission, or with a requirement to remove or reposition it, is an offence.
- 5. References to the owner of a skip include a person in possession of it under a hiring agreement.
- 6. It is recommended that level loads only, be permitted.
