THE WILDLIFE ACT 1990 (VARIATION OF SCHEDULES) (ANIMALS WHICH ARE PROTECTED) ORDER 2004

Laid before Tynwald 13th July 2004

Coming into operation 16th July 2004

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry by section 9 and 23(3) of the Wildlife Act 1990¹ and of all other enabling powers, and in accordance with the requirements of section 25 of the Act, the following Order is hereby made:-

1. Citation and Commencement

This Order may be cited as the Wildlife Act 1990 (Variation of Schedules) (Animals Which Are Protected) Order 2004 and shall come into operation on the 16th July 2004.

2. Variation of Schedule 5 of the Wildlife Act 1990

For Schedule 5 of the Wildlife Act 1990, substitute –

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(*This note is not part of the Order*)

The Order varies Schedule 5 of the Wildlife Act 1990 (Animals Which Are Protected) by adding the Lesser Beefly (*Bombylius minor*) and the Scarce Crimson and Gold Moth (*Pyrausta sanguinalis*), and removing the Sand Lizard (*Lacerta agilis*), Pod Lover Moth (*Hadena perplexa capsophila*) and the Common Otter (*Lutra lutra*).
