

Shipping forecast for the North Irish Sea



Valid for 24 Hours Issued on Thursday, 28 March 2024 at 9:30pm by Ronaldsway Met Office

Warnings: Strong winds.

Synopsis: A complex area of low pressure covers the British Isles, as an associated frontal

trough will clear the Irish Sea tonight.

Wind: Cyclonic 4 to 6, quickly settling west then backing southerly 3 or 4 overnight.

Increasing 4 or 5 tomorrow morning.

State of Sea: Slight or moderate.

Weather: Outbreaks of rain, becoming mainly fair overnight, then occasional showers

tomorrow.

Visibility: Good, occasionally moderate in rain or showers.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Wind: Southerly 4 or 5, backing southeast 3 or 4 later. **State of Sea:** Slight or moderate, falling slight Saturday afternoon.

Weather: Isolated showers.

Visibility: Good, occasionally moderate in showers.
