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ANIMALS (IMPORTATION) ORDER 1949 THE AGRICULTURAL MARKETING ACTS 1934 – 1955

APPLICATION TO IMPORT PURE BRED RAMS OF THE SCOTTISH, CHEVIOT, SWALEDALE, TEESWATER, BLUE-FACED LEICESTER OR DERBYSHIRE GRITSTONE BREEDS UNDER SPECIAL CONDITIONS

I, the undersigned, apply for a special licence to import:

I understand that:				
1	Prior to the issue of a licence the proposed premises must be inspected, approved and a notice of			
2	 approval issued by a DEFA Officer. The ram(s) must be accompanied by a Health Certificate 1137EHC and 1137SUP issued by DEFRA and signed by a Local Veterinary Inspector (LVI). Prior to signing, the LVI must be in receipt of: (a) a copy of the post import isolation premises approval notice issued by DEFA. (b) a written declaration from the owner/exporter stating that the said animal(s) are of the following breeds, Scottish Blackface, Cheviot, Swaledale, Teeswater, Blue-Faced Leicester or Derbyshire Gritstone. (c) a written declaration by the owner/exporter that the said animal(s) is/are over 9 months of age at the time of export. 			
3	On arrival to the Island they must be strictly isolated from all other sheep for a period of 30 days at the premises designated on the licence and approved by DEFA.			
4	After the first 20 days of the isolation period I must arrange for my Veterinary Surgeon to take a blood sample from the imported ram(s) for submission to an approved laboratory for testing by the AGID test or ELISA test for Maedi/Visna disease. Furthermore I undertake to have the test repeated in 6 months' time. I give my permission for my Private Veterinary surgeon to disclose the results of all tests to the Chief Veterinary Officer.			
5	In the event that the tests are positive for that disease, I must immediately arrange for the ram(s) to be slaughtered. Any remaining sheep in the group will require three negative blood results at intervals of 6 months.

7	The imported sheep must be treated in compliance with the Treatment of Sheep Order 1984 and any other conditions currently in force and stated on the licence.
