## ONLINE GAMBLING REGULATION ACT 2001

### ONLINE GAMBLING (LICENCE FEES) REGULATIONS 2009

*Laid before Tynwald*

*19<sup>th</sup> May 2009*

*Coming into operation*

*1<sup>st</sup> June 2009*

The Treasury makes these Regulations under sections 5 and 21 of the Online Gambling Regulation Act 2001<sup>1</sup>.

#### **1. Title, commencement and interpretation**

- (1) The title of these Regulations is the Online Gambling (Licence Fees) Regulations 2009.
- (2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1 June 2009.
- (3) In these Regulations —

"licence" means a licence granted under section 4 or renewed under section 8 of the Online Gambling Regulation Act 2001;

"full licence" means a licence other than a sub-licence;

"sub-licence" means a licence subject to a condition that the holder shall conduct no online gambling other than a game or lottery operated by the holder of a full licence.

#### **2. Application fee**

The fee payable to the Treasury on an application for the grant of a licence is £1,000.

#### **3. Licence fee**

The annual fee payable by the holder of a licence is —

- (a) £35,000, in the case of a full licence;
- (a) £5,000, in the case of a sub-licence.

The Online Gambling (Licence Fees) Order 2004<sup>2</sup> is revoked.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

These Regulations specify the application fee and licence fee payable in respect of licences under the Online Gambling Regulation Act 2001. They introduce a reduced annual fee of £5,000 in the case of a "sub-licence", ie. one permitting gambling only by means of a game or lottery operated by the holder of a "full" licence.
