This form should be completed in conjunction with the GSC's <u>Guidance Notes for Society Lotteries</u> and the Integrity Guidance.

Before the Application Process can proceed, the prescribed Application Fee must have been paid in full.

Please Note:

- Registration with the GSC as a society lottery is relevant to each calendar year and will
 expire on 31 December. As prescribed in GBL Section 33(5) each registered society shall
 pay the statutory fee of £5.00 in order to renew its registration for the subsequent
 calendar year;
- In accordance with GBL Section 32(3)(m) no ticket or chance shall be sold by or to a person under the age of 16 years.
