

Care for the Elderly

We have a duty to ensure pensions keep pace with inflation and there is enough money to meet the costs of living.

I will continue to campaign for a change in legislation so that people never have to surrender their home to meet the cost of nursing care.

A senior citizen representative in Tynwald to represent a growing group in our society. Putting them at the forefront will remind everyone we owe our elderly a debt of gratitude for all the sacrifices they have made for us.



Housing

Providing suitable affordable housing has proven to be a difficult puzzle in recent times, resulting in many hours of discussion and expense.

I am not confident the government have agreed upon the direction of travel to meet today's needs and those of the people now and in the future.

I will support any suitable scheme which provides first time buyers the opportunity to get on the property ladder.

Independent assisted living for the elderly is an area where the provision is inadequate and where the right type of accommodation is as important as where it is in relation to local amenities.



Energy

The Manx Gas contract was unfairly biased to the provider with fixed standing charges. The new contract must be improved with greater fairness to the consumer.

Manx Electricity Authority prices are also at a level where fuel poverty is a real concern for many people.

Looking forward renewable energy is the right direction for the Island.

Investing in self-reliance schemes where traditional methods of insulation are replaced with better ways to achieve greater efficiencies and savings. Schemes to properly insulate homes should be a government initiative.

Wasting energy is no good for anyone.



First Year Priorities

Engage with government to assess all ways to aid the recovery of the economy and the prosperity of the island

Campaign for all sections of society to receive care and benefits that meet their day to day needs.

Greater transparency and accountability for decision making.

Meet the expectations of the general public with clear and timely responses in a consistent manner.

When borders are opened, there are staff managing the intake of all visitors to the Island with suitable checks at the point of arrival. Although this is not a guaranteed method of preventing the virus from being transmitted later. A robust border control must be in place for the foreseeable future.

Ensure the services delivered by Douglas Council are meeting the expectations of the residents of Douglas South.

Ensuring Pensions and benefits rise at least in line with prices
