Updated status letters/stamps for extensions

This form is only for those who currently hold pre-settled status granted by the Isle of Man Immigration Service.

There is no fee for this application.

Please complete in BLOCK CAPITALS and in black ink.

From 4th April 2024, individuals with EUSS pre-settled status who have yet to obtain settled status will have their pre-settled status automatically extended by **two years** from the expiry date of their current pre-settled status. This will allow for extra time to apply for conversion to settled status.

Proof of the automatic extension will take the form of an updated status letter for holders of pre-settled status granted to EU, EEA and Swiss citizens who were resident before 31/12/2020.

Family members who hold pre-settled status can use this form to request their passports are stamped with the new status expiry date. To receive a stamp the family members must submit this form and their current passport, during the Immigration Service public counter hours.
