1. Owners or keepers of heavy goods vehicles (see paragraph 2 below), which are licensed after 1 June 2003 are required to provide, on the enclosed form, plating particulars relating to that vehicle. When completed the plating form must be returned to the address above.
2. The vehicles to which this procedure applies are goods vehicles in categories C, C1, C+E or C1=E (i.e. vehicles with a maximum gross weight exceeding 3,500Kg, or a draw-bar trailer exceeding 2,000Kg maximum gross weight.) **(It does not apply to a haulage tractor first registered before 1 April 1973)**
3. This procedure is a one-off exercise and will not be repeated for this vehicle when subsequent applications for vehicle licences are made.

Procedures for providing plating particulars

4. No later than the submission of the application for a vehicle licence, the attached form for providing plating particulars must be completed and returned to the **Vehicle Test Centre**. If you do not comply you will be committing an offence and subsequent applications for a vehicle licence may be refused.

Plating

5. When the Vehicle Test Centre receives the attached form providing the plating particulars, an authorised examiner will prepare the plate for the vehicle without examination, if it is possible to do so under Goods Vehicles (Plating without Examination of Vehicles) Regulations 2002. If, however, the examiner is unable to plate a vehicle in this way - for example, if it appears to him that the particulars supplied are incorrect or because a notifiable alteration of the vehicle has been made, he will decline to reach a determination without an examination of the vehicle. Instead, he will use the Goods Vehicle (Plating) Regulations 1998 to call in the vehicle for a plating examination and plate the vehicle under those Regulations.
6. On completion of the plating exercise, the authorised examiner will issue a plating certificate and a Department plate specifying or confirming the vehicle's total permitted laden weight and maximum permitted laden axle weights. By virtue of Regulation 72 of the Road Vehicle (Maintenance and Use) Regulations 2002 the plate must be fitted, within 14 days from its issue, in a conspicuous and readily accessible position in the cab of the vehicle. Failure to comply will be an offence.
