PUBLIC HEALTH (NOTIFIABLE DISEASES) ORDER 2011

Approved by Tynwald: 15th November 2011 Coming into operation: 1st November 2011

The Department of Environment, Food and Agriculture, after consulting with the Department of Health, makes this Order under section 19(2) of the Public Health Act 1990¹.

1. Title

This Order is the Public Health (Notifiable Diseases) Order 2011.

2. Commencement

If approved by Tynwald², this Order comes into operation on 1st November 2011.

3. Substitution of Schedule 2

For Schedule 2 to the Public Health Act 1990 (which specifies notifiable diseases for the purposes of that Act), substitute the Schedule set out in the Schedule to this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order amends the list of notifiable diseases specified in Schedule 2 of the Public Health Act 1990 by the substitution of a new Schedule 2. The main changes involve the addition of Brucellosis, Botulism, Legionnaires' Disease and SARs to the original Schedule 2.
