**All applications must be supported by the following documents:**

- Application fee of £50 (Cheques to be made payable to Isle of Man Government)
- A current Practising Certificate from all relevant Bar Councils or Law Societies
- Confirmation of Professional Indemnity Insurance (Minimum Cover £1,000,000). Applicant must be named on the document.
- Current certificate or letter of Good Standing from relevant Bar Council or Law Society

**Originals must be supplied and these will be returned once certified copies have been taken.**

## **Procedure for Applications for Registration of Legal Practitioners**

In all cases applications must be supported by the following documents without exception:

1. An original, current Certificate or Letter of Good Standing from all relevant Bar Councils or Law Societies (originals will be verified by the General Registry and returned to applicants).
2. An original current Practising Certificate from all relevant Bar Councils or Law Societies (originals will be verified by the General Registry and returned to applicants).
3. Confirmation of Personal Indemnity Insurance (Minimum Cover £1,000,000) bearing an original signature of the insurer. Applicant must be named on the document (originals will be verified by the General Registry and returned to applicants).
4. A fully completed application form.
5. The fee of £50.00 (cheques to be made payable to Isle of Man Government).

You should make an application for re-registration no less than 4 weeks prior to the date of expiry of your current registration.
