## HARBOUR (DUES AND CHARGES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 2022

*Approved by Tynwald: 21 June 2022*  
*Coming into Operation: in accordance with regulation 2*

The Department of Infrastructure makes the following Regulations under sections 38(1), 38(2) and 39 of the Harbours Act 2010.

### 1 Title

These Regulations are the Harbour (Dues and Charges) (Amendment) Regulations 2022.

### 2 Commencement

If approved by Tynwald, these Regulations come into operation on the day after they are approved<sup>1</sup>.

### 3 Amendment of the Harbour (Dues and Charges) Regulations 2021

The Harbour (Dues and Charges) Regulations 2021<sup>2</sup> (“Principal Regulations”) are amended as follows.

### 4 Schedule 1 amended

- (1) Schedule 1 (fishing vessels, work boats and construction barges) of the Principal Regulations are amended as follows.

These Regulations increase by an average of 2%, the charges that the Department of Infrastructure may apply with respect to facilities it provides at harbours on the Island, and also in harbour dues payable by fishing vessels, work boats, construction barges, merchant vessels, pleasure vessels, large commercial yachts and tall ships.
