Summary of Results – Isle of Man Passenger Survey 2018

- Total scheduled passenger departures increased over the year by 0.5%, to 691,256 in 2018 compared to 687,981 in 2017.
- The number of visitors during 2018 increased by 0.8% to 308,263. Resident travel increased by 0.2% to 382,993. For both residents and visitors, all increases are accounted for by a rise in air travel of 5.2%. Total sea travel in 2018 fell by -6.0%.
- The number of non-business visitors staying in paid accommodation decreased very slightly by -0.7%.
- Business visitors to the Island have increased significantly by 10.1%. Business visitors travelling by air increased by 24.0%, while business visitors by sea have decreased by -31.8%.
- The estimated total expenditure by visitors to the Island during 2018 increased by 7.3% to £132.8m, and average visitor spend increased by 12.2% to £489.
- The majority of residents leaving the Island were either travelling to the North West of England (36.2%) or outside of the UK and Ireland (27.6%).

Methodology

The Isle of Man Passenger Survey is conducted by Economic Affairs, who interview departing passengers at Douglas Harbour and Ronaldsway Airport. Responses from these interviews are recorded electronically and analysed by the Department, with quarterly results available as part of the Quarterly Economic Report and in greater detail in the annual report.

In the Passenger Survey, interviewees are classified under the following definitions of passenger type:

Passenger Type	Definition
Isle of Man Residents (RES)	Isle of Man residents leaving the Island.
Period Visitors in Paid Accommodation (PVPA)	Non-business visitors who stayed in paid accommodation whilst on the Island.
Period Visitors Visiting Friends and Relatives (VFR)	Non-business visitors who stayed with friends or relatives whilst on the Island.
Business Visitors (BV)	Visitors who were on the Island for business purposes.
Day Visitors (DV)	Non-business visitors who did not stay overnight.

Throughout the Report, “quarterly” figures are presented in which “Q1” refers to January to April and “Q2” consists of those for May and June. This is to ensure that quarterly comparisons are not distorted by the timing of the Easter break.

Cases are selected using a complex sampling design. All results are re-weighted to account for the different numbers of passengers travelling by each route and mode of travel from the Island. As with any survey of this type, results are subject to random error variation.

The information contained in this report relates only to scheduled departures and does not include unscheduled departures such as some charter flights, cruise ship passengers and pleasure craft.

There has been a change to the weighting methodology for the Passenger Survey with respect to sea passengers. For 2016, 2017 and 2018 the sea departure data now incorporates passenger origination data. This means that for sea passengers, monthly data is provided at an aggregate level discerning between those passengers on the outward (or first) journey of a return trip, and those on the return (or second) journey of a return trip. Therefore, the ratio of residents to visitors for sea passengers is no longer considered an estimate, but is a known figure. The same data is not yet available from all airlines, and therefore the same ratio cannot be applied to air departures. Due to this new data source, figures for 2016 and 2017 may no longer match what was previously published under the previous estimation process.

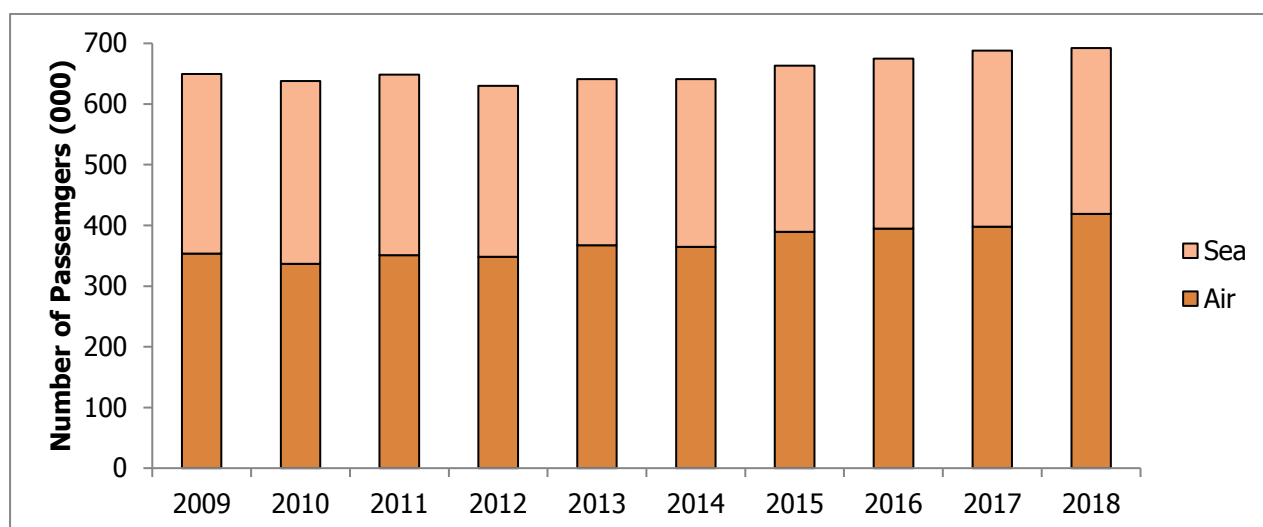

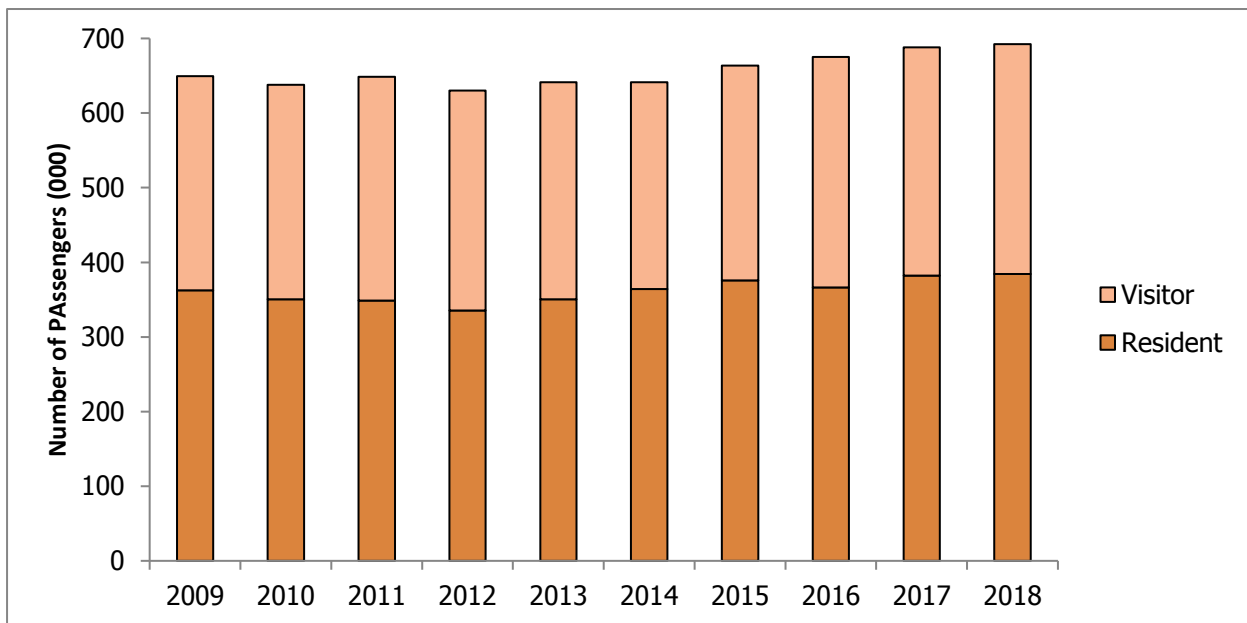

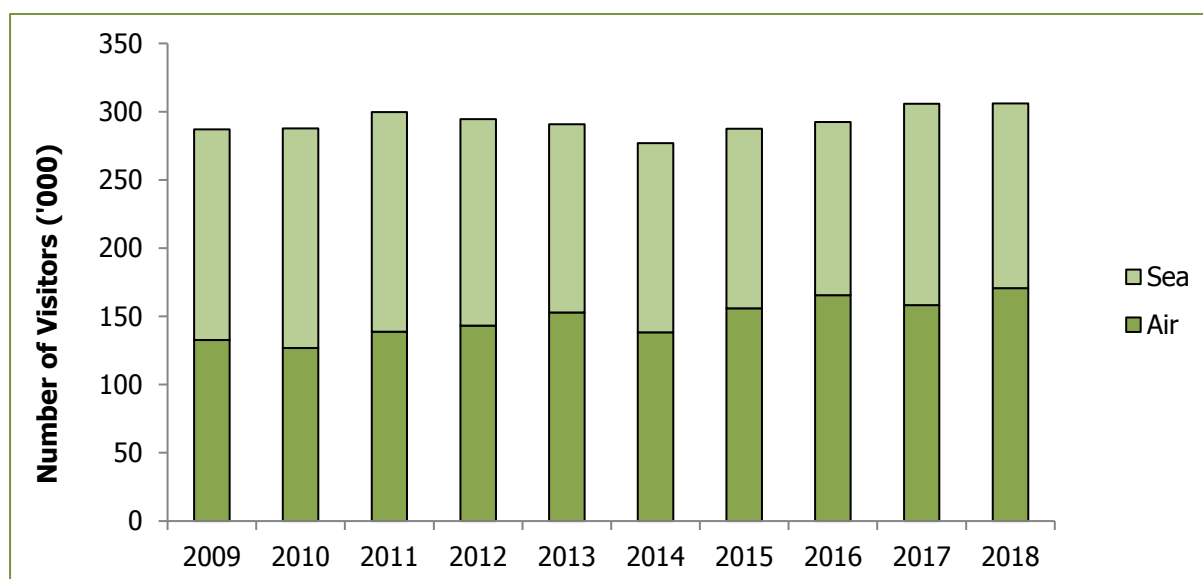

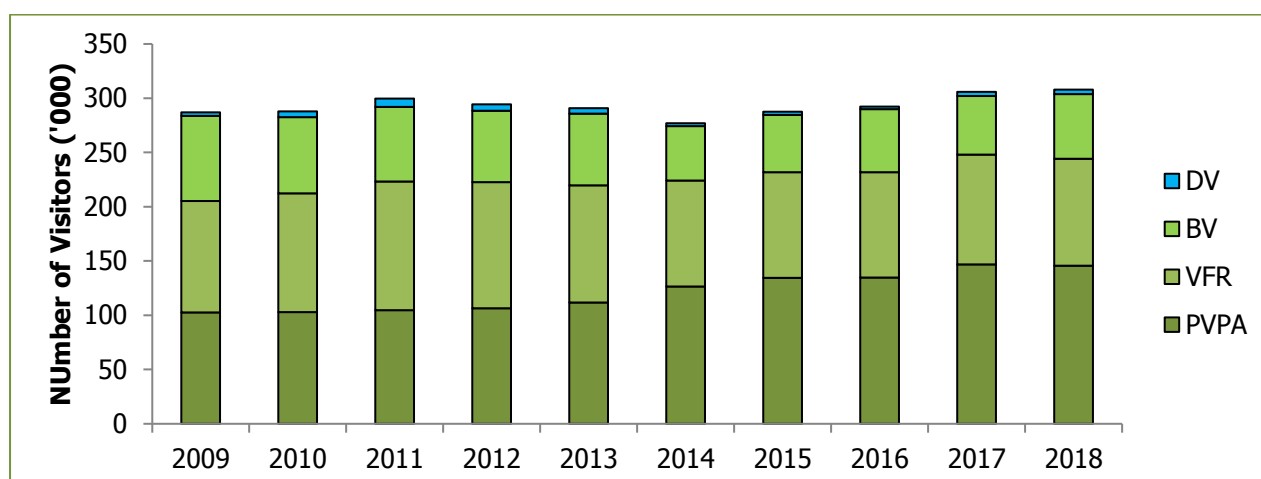

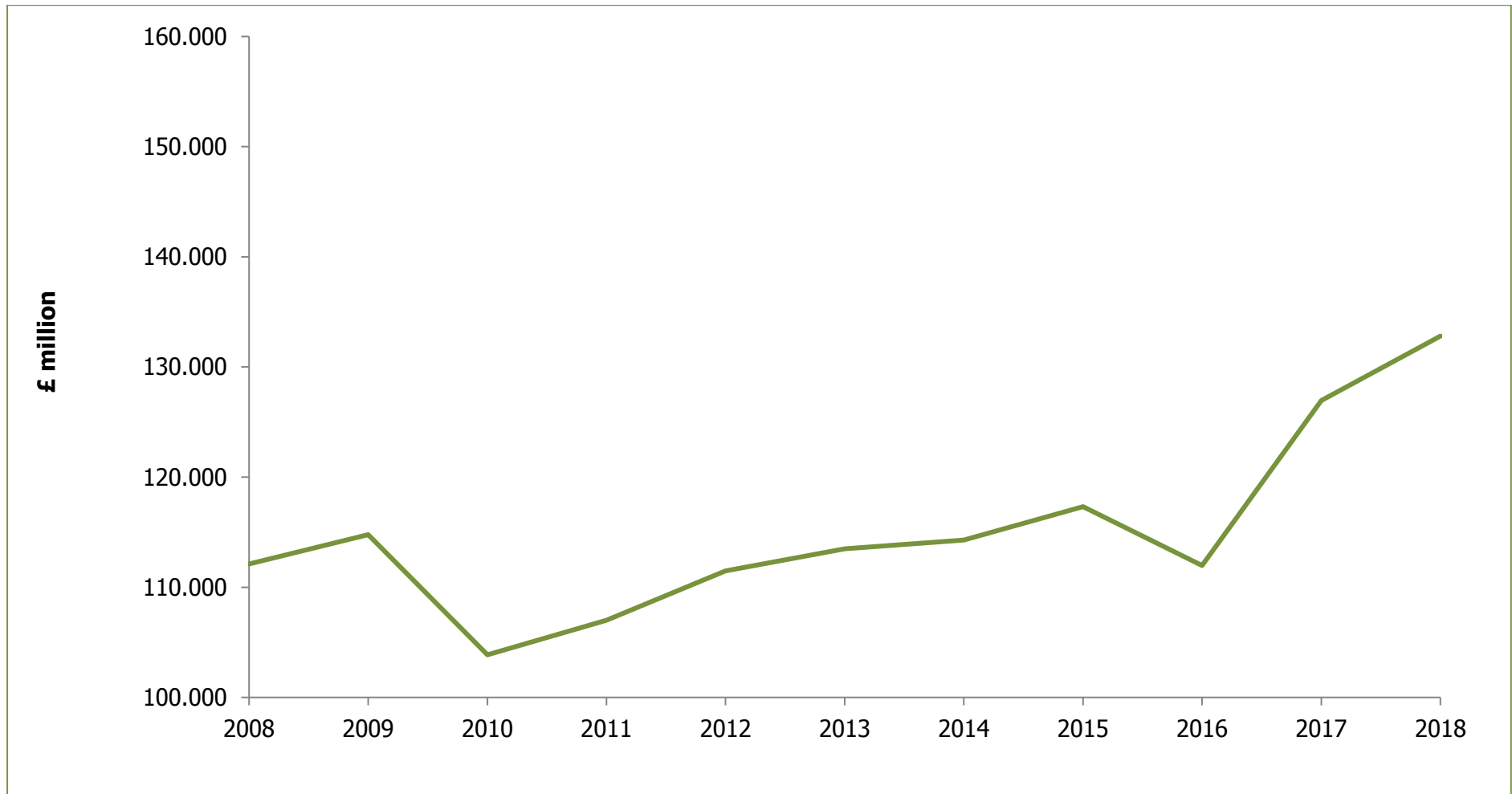

Figure 6 Area of Residence (All Visitors) (%) 2018

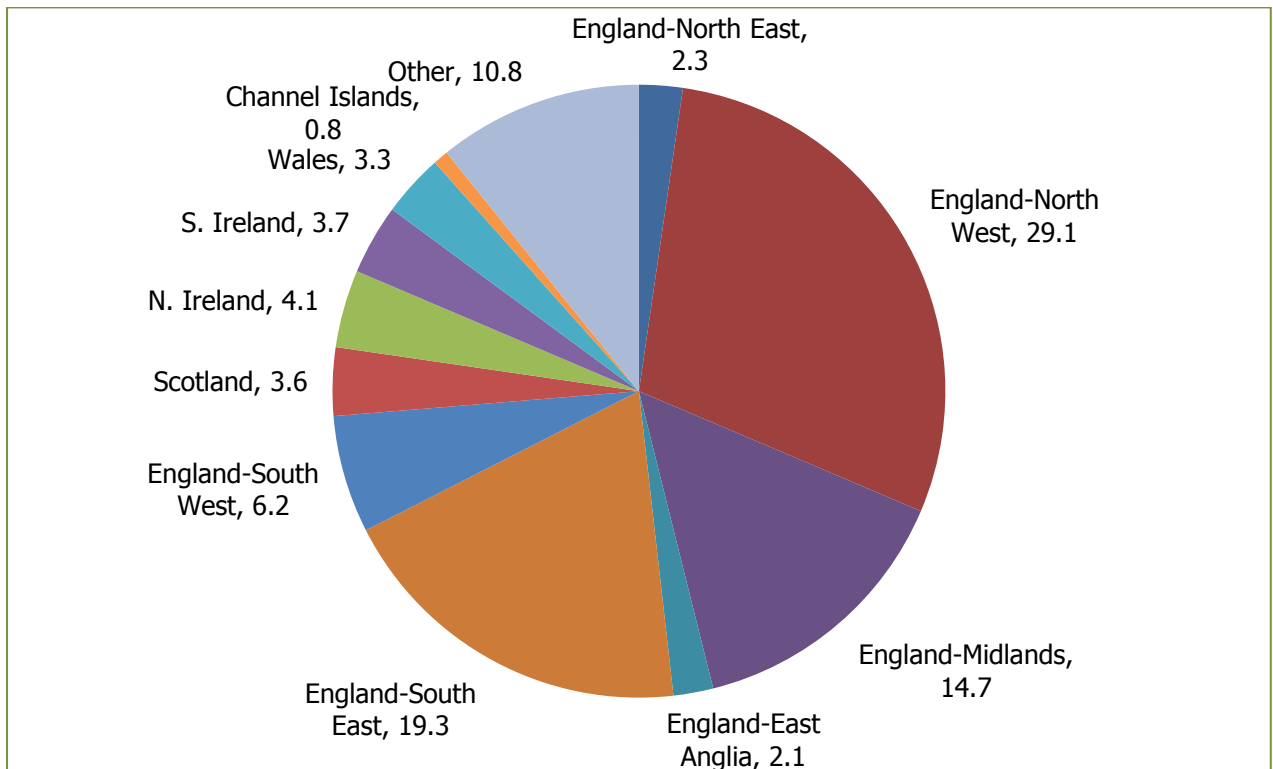

Figure 7 Main Destination of Residents (All Residents) (%) 2018

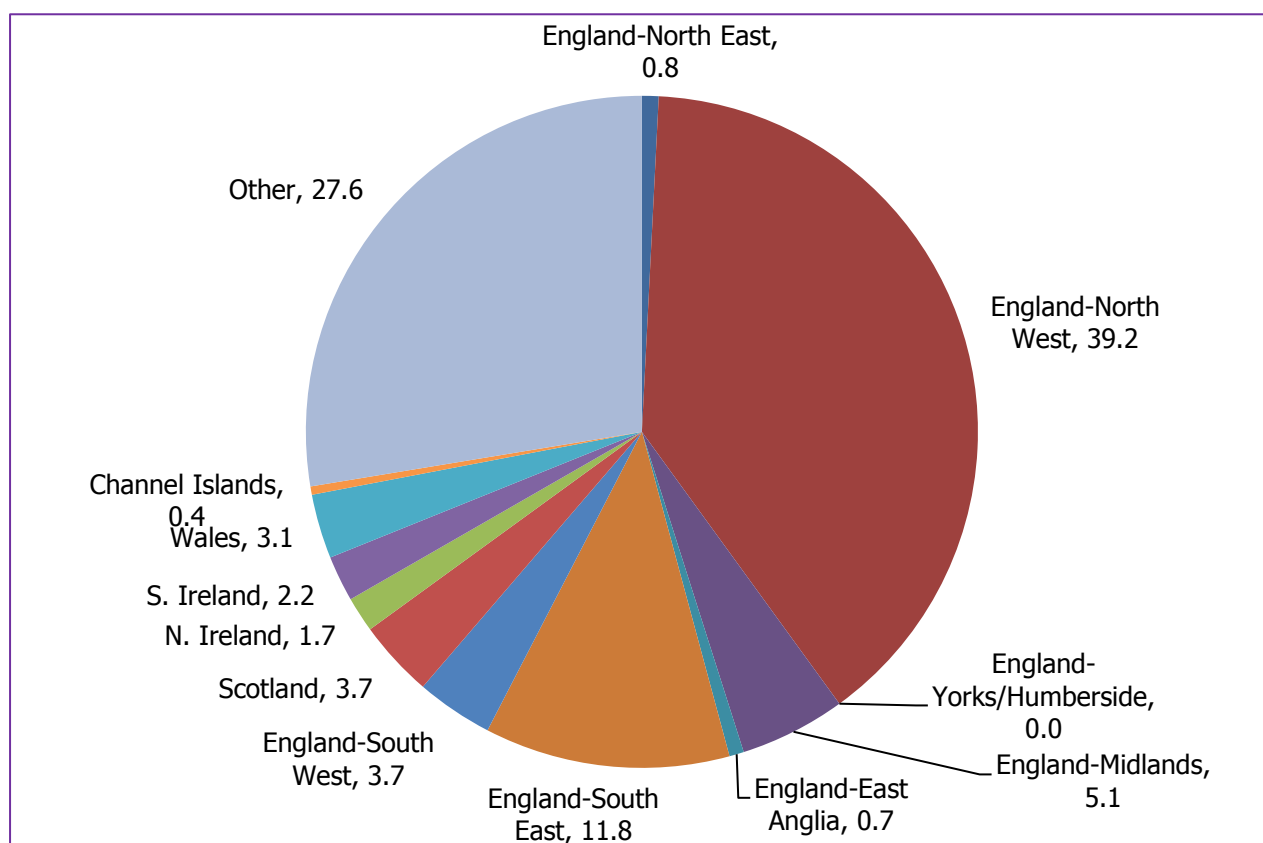
