The fee

Who can use this form?

This form should be completed by applicants who are in the Isle of Man and:

- are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen;
- are a family member of a relevant EU, EEA, Swiss citizen or British citizen of Northern Ireland*;
- are the family member who has retained the right of residence by virtue of a relationship with a relevant EU, EEA or Swiss citizen;
- are a person with a derivative right to reside;
- are a family member who has retained the right of residence by virtue of a relationship with a qualifying British Citizen.

Applications must not include adult dependants. All applicants aged 18 and over making an application under Appendix EU must complete this application form in their own right. Applicants under the age of 18 years may be included on a parent/legal guardian's application.

What documents do I need to provide in support of my application?

- Proof of continuous residence
- Proof of identity and nationality
- Proof of family relationships (where applicable)

If you are a not an EU, EEA or Swiss national

You will need to provide proof of your relationship to your EU, EEA, Swiss citizen or British citizen of Northern Ireland* family member (for example, a birth, marriage or civil partnership certificate). If you have a valid permanent residence document and provide this in support of your application, you do not need to provide this proof of relationship or evidence of your family member's identity.

*A British citizen of Northern Ireland is someone who is a British or Irish citizen (or both), and was in Northern Ireland at the time of their birth. Additionally, at least one of their parents must have been a British citizen, an Irish citizen (or both) or otherwise have been entitled to reside in Northern Ireland without any restriction on their period of residence.

Proof of Residency

- If you **have been** resident the Isle of Man, UK or Channel Islands for at least 6 months in any 12 month period for 5 consecutive years you may be eligible for **Indefinite Leave to Remain**. You will need to provide proof of this when you apply.
- If you **have not been** resident the Isle of Man, UK or Channel Islands for at least 6 months in any 12 month period for 5 consecutive years, you may be eligible for **Limited Leave to Remain**. In this case you would only need to provide evidence that you live at the address provided in this application.

Documentary evidence

You will not need to provide evidence for your entire Isle of Man residence – just enough to show whether you qualify for Indefinite Leave to Remain or Limited Leave to Remain. You should only need to provide one document dated in the last six months to be granted Limited Leave to Remain.

If you have resided continuously in the UK or Channel Islands before moving to the Isle of Man, that time may be counted, and in that case documents provided for the **period of time** in the UK or Channel Islands can be submitted.

All the documents you submit as evidence must be dated and have your name on them. You should only provide 1 piece of evidence to cover each month or longer **period of time**.

Use documents that cover longer periods of time if you can, such as annual bank statements, council tax bills or university letters and certificates. This means you won't need to submit as many documents.

If you are in possession of a valid document certifying a permanent right of residence, then this is all that you will need to submit as evidence of continuous residence. No additional documents will be required.

Evidence that covers shorter periods of time

These documents count as evidence for 1 month if they have a single date on. They can be used to cover a longer period of time if they have a start and end date covering longer than a month.

- bank statement showing payments received or spending in the Isle of Man, UK or Channel Islands;
- payslip for an Isle of Man, UK or Channel Islands based job;
- water, gas or electricity bill showing an Isle of Man, UK or Channel Islands address;
- landline or mobile telephone, TV or internet bill showing an Isle of Man, UK or Channel Islands address;
- letter from your GP or hospital confirming appointments you have made or attended;
- passport stamp confirming entry at the UK border;
- used travel ticket confirming you entered the UK from another country.

Evidence that covers longer periods of time

Examples of documents that cover a longer period of time between 2 dates include:

- annual bank statement or account summary, showing at least 6 months of payments received or spending in the Isle of Man, UK or Channel Islands;
- employer letter confirming employment and evidence that the employer is genuine;
- Isle of Man Rates Demand;
- residential mortgage statement or rental agreement and evidence of payment;
- letter from a registered care home confirming your residence there;
- annual business account of a self-employed person;
- A T-21 (Employers Leaving Certificate) confirming the duration of a period of employment which has ended;
- A residential mortgage statement or tenancy agreement.

This list is not exhaustive, and you are encouraged to read the guidance notes on the Immigration Service website.
