SMALL GRANT REPORT FOR IDC: ONE WORLD CHARITY CHALLENGE PROJECT, 2015/16

- 1. Aims & Objectives: 16 Teams from 4 Secondary Schools, and King Williams College, participated, comprising over 80 students. The training, development, intra-school programs, and the Finals were delivered as planned. The £22,000 grant pool, funded equally by the IDC and the H & S Davidson Trust was divided between 16 overseas charities mostly with Manx connections, based on Judging Panel evaluations of student presentations, using clearly defined criteria. Amount of individual grants ranged from £400 to £4,000.
- 2. Project Activities: see 1 above.
- 3. Timeframe: all activities were accomplished according to the time plan.
- 4. Replication: the project is tailored to the requirements of the Isle of Man. In the past there has been interest in the project from USA and Denmark, and some years ago a Trustee made a presentation of the project to 50 philanthropists at the Rockefeller Centre, 5th Ave, New York. However, while there has been international interest, there has not yet, to our knowledge, been any replication.
- 5. Development education: this is one of the two core elements of the project, which is designed to build awareness and understanding of issues in the developing world among students, their families, teachers, and, through publicity, plus the Finals at the Manx Museum Theatre, the wider public.
- 6. Beneficiaries; plan was to benefit at least 80 IOM students, charities with a Manx connection operating overseas, and, through grants to them, at least 10,000 beneficiaries.
- 7. Community involvement: The Department for Education & Children, individual schools, students, teachers, judges, the One World Centre, and individuals from many Manx registered charities operating overseas, all contributed to this project.
- 8. Liaison with relevant authorities: See 7 above.
- 9. Sustainability: this project has been funded since 2008 by the H & S Davidson Trust, with matched funding of the grant pool by the International Development Committee.
- 10. Monitoring and Evaluation: key measures are number of schools and teams participating, level of involvement, quality of presentations, and responses by students to a feedback questionnaire. These are developed and evaluated by One World Centre personnel involved in the day to day management of the project, and reviewed with two Trustees from the H & S Davidson Trust as a basis for planning the next year's program. Aim is to continually improve the quality & effectiveness of the program.
- 11. Sustainable Development Goal: SDG 1 was achieved as planned, and most of the other SDG's were addressed by the project.
- 12. Budget: this was delivered as planned. H & S Davidson Trust contributed £11,000 to the grant pool, and the IDC matched this for a total of £22,000 distributed to NGOs with Manx connections, operating overseas. See 1 above. H&S Davidson Trust also made a grant to cover all management expenses of the
