Overview of the project to date

Grant Holder: **DO! Developing Orphans**

Project: Construction of Multi-Purpose Hall and Teacher Accommodation

Grant: SG006:17 awarded 25th May 2017, funding received by DO! Developing Orphans

on 30th June 2017 after the application 22nd April 2017 for commencement 2017.

Location: **Broadway Nursery and Primary School, Padibe, Lamwo District, northern Uganda**Uganda ranked 163 by UN for Human Development Indicators, 70% of population living in multidimensional poverty. Northern Uganda economy poorer, trying to rebuild after 20year LRA civil war

Major Purpose of the Grant: To enable the Broadway School to continue operating as a school by being fully registered by the Ugandan Ministry of Education and Sports.

To be registered Broadway School requires both the Multi-Purpose Hall and Teachers accommodation to be built. Broadway School in January 2017 was given 2 years to do so.

If the Hall and Accommodation are not completed within this 2year timeframe given by the Ugandan Government Ministry of Education and Sport the school will be closed down by the Ugandan Government, as it will not be allowed to carry on without a full registration.

A good quality, well-built Multi-Purpose Hall is the outcome of the first year of SG006:17.

This building has been completed to a high standard of finish as this Year One Report cover photo shows. Building commenced in July 2017 and the final coat of paint was applied March 2018.

Overall objectives of the project

- 1. High quality education for students to complete Primary Leaving Examinations
- 2. Students gain prospects of a promising future to attend further education either at secondary level or vocational studies

From the start of the Hall construction, the evident quality of the Hall building work, the commitment to build the teacher accommodation as Year 2 of SG 006:17, along with the teaching standards and the rest of the school facilities, created excitement in the Ugandan education authorities.

The Uganda Ministry of Education made a recommendation to the Uganda National Examination Board (UNEB) for the Broadway Primary School to become an Examination Centre.

The Uganda National Examination Board (UNEB) approved the building to be the District Examination Centre for the Primary Leaving Examination (PLE) on Thursday 22nd March 2018.

Successfully addressing the project objectives 1 and 2 of allowing students at the Broadway Primary School to complete Primary Leaving Examinations (PLE) gaining the prospects of a promising future.

In addition, as an Examination Centre the Broadway Primary School Multi-Purpose Hall will host the surrounding Ugandan government primary schools PLE students as well, for the PLE examinations. November 2018 will see 150 primary school students undertake the PLE in the Hall.

3. Secure high-quality teachers by providing accommodation on site

This aspect of the project will be undertaken in Year2 SG006:17 so has yet to be addressed.

Once the accommodation is underway many teachers will want to be on the school staff and the Broadway school will be able to cherry pick high-quality teachers to enhance the already high standard of education delivered to its students.

The Ugandan Ministry of Education & Sport has, however, on the continued commitment of DO! supported by the Isle of Man Government for Year 2 SG006:17 build of the teacher accommodation, granted the school full registration. They will inspect the teacher accommodation when built.

4. Further raise the profile of Broadway Nursery and Primary School to encourage more students to start their education at the school

Knowing the Broadway School has been registered by the Ministry of Education, ensuring a long-term future gives parents the knowledge and peace of mind to enrol their children at Broadway School facilitating project objective 4 of encouraging more students to start their education at the Broadway Nursery and Primary School.

This increased parent confidence in the school will increase the number of students enrolled enhancing the sustainability of the school, it's operation and maintenance of the project buildings after completion of the project.

Spending against the approved budget

The £ sterling budget for the 2 years was £60,119, with the Multipurpose Hall element of the budget being £32,040.

The Multi-Purpose Hall build cost came in under the sterling budget by 6%, costing a total of £30,118.13, utilising the full first year grant £27,053.55 and £3,064.58 of the required DO! 10% for the overall project.

Funds were agreed between DO! Trustees and the Project Manager Okoya John Calvin in Uganda and released to Uganda for the next stage of work after photographic evidence was supplied of the previous build stage. (See Photos of Build Stages End Year 1 Report SG 006:17)

Variances to the budgeted build costs were a blend of better than anticipated exchange rates and one major build cost increase caused by the change of roof materials requested by the Ugandan Buildings Inspector.

The £sterling budget was prepared in the wake of the uncertainty of Brexit with the pound falling heavily against the US\$. The local Ugandan currency the Ugandan Shilling (UGX) exchange rates mirror the US\$ so the £/UGX exchange rate was expected to continue in free fall. The average rate achieved over the first year was 4,486UGX against a budget of 4,000UGX/£.

The Multi-Purpose Hall actual Ugandan Shilling cost is more than the original UGX budget due to the Lamwo District Engineer responsible for ensuring the building is well constructed and safe requiring a change in the proposed building materials used for the roof construction when he came for an onsite inspection.

He felt that for the roof span the weight of the iron roofing sheets would be too great for the proposed and budgeted Cypress wood trusses, beams, struts, rafters and requested a change to metal costing an additional £1,735.63 @budget rate of 4,000UGX/£ (6,942,500UGX).

The sterling roof increase cost was mitigated by DO! sending money via Manxfx Moneycorp as they give better exchange rates and date of funds availability in Uganda, rather than bank to bank. The bank to bank exchanges were well under the average exchange rate finally achieved for the project.

The Multi-Purpose Hall was built in 8 stages. Each stage of build is fully documented by Invoices and Receipts for the work done.

Due to the weak Ugandan Shilling and increased development in the region due to a dam being built 30 kms away from the Padibe location of the Broadway school the price of cement has gone up. This has impacted the build cost of the sub and super structures of the houses and latrines.

Despite these increased 2018 costs the 2year project SG006:17 awarded to DO! Developing Orphans for the Construction of a Multi-Purpose Hall and Teacher Accommodation with latrines should come in under the original budget because of the improved exchange rate achieved in Year1.

The budget for the second year remains with the original budget exchange rate of 4,000UGX/£sterling because of the general economic and political uncertainty in the world.

As per the Multi-Purpose Hall the Teacher Accommodation and Latrines will be built in stages, with finances agreed at each stage with DO! Trustees. Stage costs invoices and receipts will be received, with the next stage financing being released on photographic proof of the completion of the previous build stage.

The 2017-2018 DO! Developing Orphans Year End March 2018 Accounts will be fully reviewed.

Monitoring

Project

Chair of DO! Developing Orphans Trustee Patricia Wiles visited the Broadway School Multi-Purpose Hall project in September/October 2017 and photographs of the visit are included in the build stage photo End Year 1 Report.

Trustees Jayne Hanley and Patricia Wiles are undertaking a Corporate Governance Trip to check the completed Multi-Purpose Hall leaving the Isle of Man April 21st 2018 returning 6th May 2018.

The 2017-2018 DO! Developing Orphans Year End March 2018 Accounts which include the SG 006:17 spend will have an independent examination by a qualified independent examiner in accordance with section 5 of the Charities Registration Act 1989.

In Uganda a separate Broadway School bank account was set up especially for the project for transparency.

Safeguarding has always been an important aspect of DO! Developing Orphans work, and the charity supplied the Isle of Man Government with a Statement of Assurance on this matter on 28th February 2018 and received a very positive response 2nd March 2018 from the International Development team.

Monitoring of charity DO! Developing Orphans

IOMFSA monitors DO! Developing Orphans. To ensure compliance with all legislation DO! Trustees have undertaken training 2017-2018 with Financial Intelligence Unit, Isle of Man Vetting Bureau and through the One World Centre the new GDPR legislation, in order to ensure ongoing compliance in legal and regulatory matters. The charity also ensures its information is updated with the Isle of Man General Registry.

Project Delivery Plan-Year 1

The original time plan submitted for the grant application had both buildings – the Multi-Purpose Hall and the Teachers Accommodation being built simultaneously, which meant none of the buildings would be completed and useable till November 2018. This would have meant the PLE examinations could not have been held at the school this year as there would be insufficient time for UNEB to approve the Hall building as suitable for an Examination Centre.

The revised plan has them being built one after the other starting with the Multi-Purpose Hall in Year 1 of SG 006:17 which gives the most benefits to the pupils, staff and Parent Teachers Association.

This change to the project was communicated and approved by the Isle of Man Government email 28th November 2017. Chair and project main contact Patricia Wiles was impacted by the terminal illness and death of her brother during the grant stages of 2017.

Construction of the hall was accelerated by good fortune because the doors and window frames fabricator's factory was in the way of the new road being constructed by the Chinese Government.

In order not delay the road the Chinese officials sent in Chinese welders to add to the local Ugandan staff to fulfil all the fabricator's order book quickly.

Ongoing Project Delivery Plan- Year 2

The revised both buildings completed project timetable has them built December 2018 subject to the timing of the Year 2 SG 006:17 grant funding being received- if it is received earlier the teacher's accommodation will be finished earlier

How the delivery of the project has benefitted the community to date direct or indirect benefits

Directly: Students at the school will benefit from a high-quality education and qualifications upon completion of their primary education

 With the completion of the Multi-Purpose Hall, the school is on track to complete all structures in the 2year timeframe to end of January 2019 of the licence given by the Ugandan Schools Inspector before full registration had to be completed or the school closed down.

Having a completed and approved Multi-Purpose Hall of the required size, structure and quality of build for Primary Leaving Examinations to be held in, means the school will be able to continue to deliver high-quality education and facilitate qualifications for the local community ongoing, as the Hall will enable full registration of the Broadway School provided the Year 2 component of the grant teachers accommodation is also completed.

The Multi-Purpose Hall was one of the two requirements for the Broadway Nursery and Primary School identified by a Ugandan Schools Inspector in January 2017 to enable it to be fully registered by the Ugandan Ministry of Education and Sport as an educational establishment.

2. Having the Multi-Purpose Hall enables the Broadway Primary School to be registered as an examination centre. The Broadway Primary School has now been approved as a Primary Leaving Examination (PLE) Centre by UNEB (Uganda National Examination Board) enabling the first PLE examination to take place in November 2018.

This gives the Broadway school students the security of knowing the exam venue, and so the confidence to do well in the PLE exams as the stress of travelling to an examination centre further away and being away from home is taken away.

The PLE, which pupils undertake at the end of seven years of Primary Education, is the examination that gives a qualification to pupils who have undertaken 7 years of Primary Education in Uganda and enables them to be eligible to continue education through Vocational or Secondary studies.

3. 30 Broadway Primary School pupils will sit the PLE in 2018. These are the first class of Primary 7 pupils the Broadway School has produced and so the first to sit the PLE exam.

The results of the first PLE examination will demonstrate to the community the high quality of education delivered by the Broadway Nursery and Primary School.

This will raise the Broadway School's profile in the community and encourage more parents to send their children to the school to gain a good education.

Having more pupils will make the Broadway School financially stable ongoing able to maintain the building through its own finances.

In addition, 120 local government school primary students will take their PLE in the new Multi-Purpose Hall at the Broadway School, Padibe in November 2018.

Directly: High Quality teachers will have better access to quality accommodation that is accessible

4. The second requirement for full registration of Broadway School is teachers' accommodation of good quality, which will attract high quality teachers.

This accommodation will be built with the support of SG006:17 in Year 2 of the project enabling the achievement of this benefit.

Indirectly: Local labourers and suppliers in the community will benefit from employment opportunities that arise during construction

5. The Multi-Purpose Hall build costs, £30,118.13 in total, paid to suppliers and labour has had a significant beneficial impact on the economy of Padibe and its community.

These indirect beneficiaries benefit throughout the project from working on the Multi-Purpose Hall building and supplying goods and services for the construction.

7 local companies were beneficiaries through the supply of materials and transport.

Amongst the 27 builders were some orphans who have undertaken Vocational Trade Skills training through DO! Developing Orphans. Working under Master Builders on the site they have developed their building skills and learned the "tricks of the trade" to work at higher levels of the construction industry, as well as earning a good income for their labours.

8 women supported the build by carrying water to the site.
