What are eJournals?



Logging In


When you first go to <https://journals.nice.org.uk/> it is important to log in with your Athens. This means the system will recognise the specific journals you have access to as opposed to offering generic NHS results.

Checking Your Access

Once you have logged in, check your access by typing the title or ISSN of the journal you want to check into the search bar and selecting the relevant radio button.

Locating your article

Your results will show journals with matching titles, where to access them, and the dates they are available between.

Click on the blue link next to whichever title and access option suits you, and this will take you to the website to gain access. If you're looking for a specific article then make note of the year, volume, and issue number so that you can find it.

Tip: Some journals have an embargo in place, instead of a fixed end date they will have a set period of time such as 1 year, or 30 days. This means you get a bit more access every single day.
