Part I Decisions made by Council

Stay Responsible The challenges posed by the Coronavirus [SARS-CoV-2] pandemic [COVID-19] requires a clear and joined up response

Coronavirus Measures – Review of Borders Framework

Council considered papers submitted by the Cabinet Office providing an update on the current IOM and UK COVID-19 situation, and seeking a review of the current Borders framework and the mitigations to protect the Island. After consideration, a number of recommendations in relation to self-isolation and testing pathways requirements, and the Border Framework were supported with clear implementation timelines.

Public Health Act 1990

Council considered and agreed that the following documents under the Public Health Act 1990 be made and submitted to Tynwald.

- Public Health Protection (Coronavirus) Regulations 2020
- Declaration of serious and imminent threat to public health
- Public Health Protection (Coronavirus) (Amendment) Regulations 2020

Department of Education, Sport and Culture – Interim Organisational Framework Implementation Plan

Public Appointments – Isle of Man Office of Fair Trading

Council considered a paper submitted by the Cabinet Office and agreed the appointment of Mr Michael Bathgate as a lay member of the Board of the Isle of Man Office of Fair Trading, for a term of five years from the date of appointment, subject to the approval of Tynwald.

Licensing – Public Consultation

Council considered a paper submitted by the Department of Home Affairs and agreed that a public consultation be launched on planned changes to the alcohol licensing regime in the Island.

Courts, Tribunals and Local Authority Procedures, and Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2020 (Appointed Day) Order 2020

Council considered a paper submitted by the Cabinet Office and agreed that the Courts, Tribunals and Local Authority Procedures, And Miscellaneous Provisions Act 2020 (Appointed Day) Order 2020 be made and submitted to Tynwald.

Tynwald Auditor General Act 2011 (Appointed Day) Order 2020

Council considered a paper submitted by the Cabinet Office, and agreed that the Tynwald Auditor General Act 2011 (Appointed Day) Order 2020 be made and submitted to Tynwald.

Communications (Television Licensing) (Amendment) Regulations 2021

Council considered a paper submitted by the Cabinet Office, and agreed that the Communications (Television Licensing) (Amendment) Regulations 2021 be extended to the Island, and that this decision be communicated to the UK Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport.

UK/EU Negotiations – Isle of Man Deal

Extension of the Intellectual Property Treaties of Nice, Singapore and Locarno to the Island

Council considered a paper submitted by the Department for Enterprise and agreed that the following intellectual property treaties be extended to the Island, and that the decision be communicated to the UK Intellectual Property Office:

- The Nice Agreement, concluded at Nice in 1957, revised at Stockholm in 1967 and at Geneva in 1977, as amended in 1979;
- The Singapore Treaty on the Law of Trademarks 2006;
- The Locarno Agreement Establishing an International Classification for Industrial Designs signed at Locarno on October 8, 1968, as amended on September 28, 1979.

Inclusion of the Isle of Man in future bilateral driving licence exchange agreements with the European Union Member States

Council considered a paper submitted by the Cabinet Office, and agreed that the Isle of Man be included in any bilateral driving exchange agreements that the UK is able to negotiate with the European Union Member States, and that this decision be communicated to the UK Department for Transport.

Motor Insurance Bureau Agreements with the IOM for Uninsured and Untraced drivers

Council considered a paper submitted by the Department of Infrastructure, and agreed that the updated Uninsured and Untraced Drivers Agreement between the Department for Infrastructure and the UK Motor Insurers' Bureau be signed.
