JW asked if there have been any incidents before TT in relation to off road biking and MK responded no which is a positive note.

FW commented that the Heritage Trail had got a lot of use and residents driving up Glen Lough to Douglas – possibly look at placing a gate.

HQ commented on her email to the group in regard to very few PROW are available to horses, horse riders may seek permission from landowners to river over their land. Many landowners are open to this in principle, but are concerned about the potential legal ramifications, such as liability in aces of accidents and setting a precedent for public use. HQ would like to prepare guidance for BHS members, recommending steps which can be taken to alleviate such concerns and asked the group if they have any experience of putting in place Agreements for permissive access.

HQ commented both GW and SC are interest to discuss permissive access. FW informed HQ that liability would be on the landowners and provide their own insurance. In regard to public use they will need to put up signs themselves and the Department could assist with a template for permissive access i.e. Dogs must be on a lead.

HQ to circulate a few thoughts to the group for their comment.

AH informed the meeting Lee Helwich has tendered his resignation as ACU Rights of Way Officer and therefore he has requested to be removed from the CAG group. Lee thanked the group for the 18 months he held in post and felt very welcome when attending the meeting and he is sure they will introduce a new ACU Rights of Way office who would wish to attend the meetings.
