# description

This deteched cement rendered and thatched cottage is set cace from the road in a pleasing small garden. The traditional two room layout and simple rectangular windows have been prespected and the whole property is well maintained to it's original specifications. There are two chimneys, one in back gable call both of which display their stonework above thatch layer and are not cement rendered.

# recommendation

The cottage should be listed for preservation as one of the few remaining examples of it's type in the south of the island. The property is well maintained and is sited well with respect to public view and enjoyment.
