#### **April Theme: E-Books**

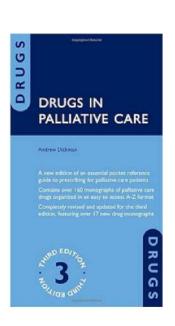

A Kortext book, on the other hand, is accessible as one PDF file but readers can skip to any chapter using the interactive (hyperlinked) table of contents. Both OUP and Kortext offer search, and you can bookmark within the PDF files. Kortext offers a neat 'read aloud' function for multitasking busy bees out there.

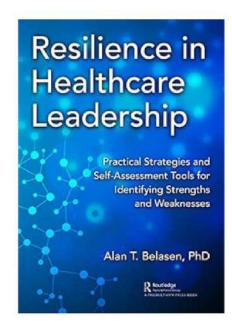

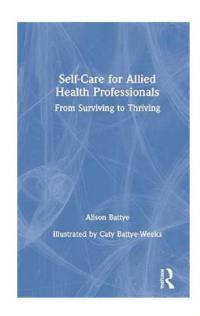

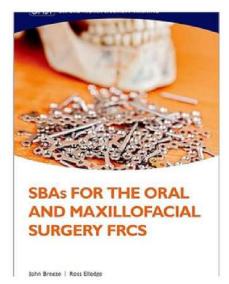
