Death Grant Nomination Form – Guidance Notes for Members

- To qualify for payment of lump sum death benefits you must, at the time of your death, have been a member of the Scheme and not have been in retirement for more than 5 years.
- You may nominate anyone you like, including an organisation. You may also nominate as many people or organisations as you like. If you nominate more than one person or organisation, say what proportion of the grant (either a percentage or a fraction) you would like each to receive. If you do not give a proportion, we will divide the grant equally between the people or organisations you have named.
- This form applies only to members of the Police Pension Regulations 2010 (PPR 2010). If you joined the police service on or after 1 April 2010, you are a member of PPR 2010 unless you opted out. Please contact the PSPA if you are not sure which scheme you are in.
- » It is your responsibility to ensure that the nominee is acquainted with the terms of the nomination.
- You should ensure that the PSPA or the executors of your will (if there are any) are advised of any change in your nominee's address. If the nominee is under 18 years of age, the lump sum will be paid to their legal guardian.
- » The form asks you to state any nominated person's relationship to you. You do not have to give this if you do not wish to, but it will help us deal sensitively with matters if you die.
- » A nomination will not be effective if at the time of your death you leave a surviving spouse, civil partner or unmarried partner who is entitled to benefits under PPR2010. In these circumstances, the grant will be paid to that person (refer to the PPR2010 Members' Guide for more information about the lump sum death grant and about survivor benefits in general). The nomination will take effect if you have no spouse or unmarried partner, or if both you and your spouse or unmarried partner were to die at the same time.
- You may wish to consider changing your nomination if your personal circumstances change. It is your responsibility to keep it up to date, including the address of anyone you have nominated.
- your pension administrator will acknowledge the nomination by returning a copy for you to keep. If you wish to revoke your nomination you must do so in writing. You should contact your pension administrator for a new form.
- » Your nomination is not binding on the Public Sector Pensions Authority. If for any reason we do not pay the grant to the person you have named, we will pay it to your personal representative.

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
