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INTRODUCTION

The Interim Census held on the Isle of Man on 14th April 1996 was taken under the authority of the Census Act 1929 as amended by the Treasury Act 1985. Full censuses are undertaken on the Island every ten years, the last one of which was held in 1991. Interim censuses have been held on the Isle of Man between full censuses every ten years and are designed to provide information only on the basic demographic details, therefore the extent of the coverage of this Census Report will be smaller than its 1991 predecessor.

The first volume of results from the 1996 (Interim) Census was released in October 1996 and presented basic details of the resident population in terms of population size, population by Island area, age, sex, place of birth and the industrial classification of those employed. This second volume of results presents a comprehensive set of tables, graphs and maps covering virtually all aspects of the Census questionnaire and featuring extensive cross-referencing of topics and comparative statistics from previous censuses.

For the first time in an Isle of Man census report, a geographic information system has been used to provide a visual presentation of some of the main Census results.

This report should accommodate most areas of demographic interest concerning the Isle of Man, but additional information may be provided on request, subject to confidentiality, by applying to the address at the back of this report.

GENERAL EXPLANATORY NOTES

The following definitions relate to the headings used in the Census tables and to concepts underlying Census analysis.

Population Base

The main purpose of the Census is to gather information on the Island's resident population. Hence, unless specified, all of the tables in this Census report refer to the resident population of the Isle of Man. To facilitate historical comparisons, it is traditional to also examine the figure for the Census population, which is the resident population plus visitors to the Island on Census night. There is also the de facto population, defined as the number of people actually on the Island on Census night. However, the statistics that concern the Government and most other census users are those derived from analysis of the resident population. To summarise the above definitions:

Isle of Man Resident Population	Isle of Man Residents Present on Census Night + Residents Absent from the Island on Census Night.
Isle of Man Census Population	Isle of Man Resident Population + Visitors to the Island on Census Night.
Isle of Man De Facto Population	Isle of Man Residents Present on Census Night + Visitors to the Island on Census Night.

Visitors

For census purposes, a visitor is defined as a person whose usual place of residence is outside the Isle of Man. This includes persons who are visiting the Island on holiday, on business or to work for a temporary period but who do not intend to take up residence in the Island in the immediate future. Visitors working on the Island for a temporary period of more than three days were asked to answer the questions on occupation, industry and work permits. This last group are referred to as "working visitors" in this report.

Private Households and Communal Establishments

A household comprises either one person living alone or a group of persons (who may or may not be related) living at the same address with common housekeeping, such as sharing one meal a day together. Persons were also enumerated in a variety of communal (non-private) establishments whose distinguishing feature is some form of communal catering. The statistics presented on average household size excludes persons in communal establishments.

Census Districts/Enumeration Districts

Each of the Island's 24 towns, villages and parishes comprises a census district. An enumeration district covers the area of work of a particular enumerator. Heavily populated areas will therefore contain many enumeration districts (Douglas has 36), but lowly populated areas, such as Ballaugh, may just have the one enumeration district (also the census district). For census purposes, the Calf of Man is part of the district of Rushen.

When using census information for comparative purposes it should be noted that there have been boundary changes over the years. Most recently, Ramsey's boundary was extended to take in part of what was formerly Lezayre.

Dependency Ratio

The dependency ratio is the number of people under 16 years old and the number of retirement age as a percentage of the working age population. Those of retirement age are taken to be all women 60 years old and over and all men 65 years old and over. The working age are all adults over the age of 16 and under the age of 60 for women and 65 for men. The dependency ratio is a commonly used demographic indicator to demonstrate age distribution within a country.

Place of Birth

Many countries have been grouped together on statistics relating to place of birth. The groupings used are as follows:

Employed/Economically Active

The statistics on the employed population refer to the number of those in the resident population employed at the time of the Census. The economically active population is comprised of the resident employed population and the resident unemployed who are looking for work.

Occupation

Information on employment by occupation, unless otherwise stated, relates to the main occupation of persons in employment or self-employment. The person's description of the tasks undertaken in their occupation was used to assign him/her to an occupational group. The unemployed who are looking for work were also assigned to an occupational group depending on their previous occupation. The unemployed were defined according to International Labour Organisation (ILO) definition. This defines the unemployed as people without a job who were available to start work in two weeks and who had either looked for work four weeks previously or were waiting to start work already obtained.

The classification system used is the UK Standard Occupational Classification (SOC), also used by the UK Government. This system is a tiered structure consisting of 9 major occupational groups, 22 sub-major groups, 77 minor groups and 371 unit groups. To make the results fairly detailed but readily interpretable, this report presents occupational details by sub-major group. Results can be presented by any of the other structures on request, subject to confidentiality.

Social Class

Social Class is used to group persons with similar levels of occupational skill. A person's social class is derived from their unit group by the SOC system. The unemployed who are looking for work were again classified according to their previous occupation. Persons not economically active are not allocated a social class.

Industry

As with occupation, information on employment by industry relates to the main occupation of persons in employment or self-employment. The person's description of their employer's business is used to assign him/her to an industrial sector. The Isle of Man industrial classification system has 25 such sectors and each company or organisation is allocated to one of these sectors.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. The Isle of Man resident population in the April 1996 (Interim) Census was 71,714, an increase of 2.8% on the 1991 Census figure. This represents a significant slowdown in population growth from the 1986-91 period when the population grew by 8.6%. The census population figure increased 4.8% in 1991-96 to stand at 74,680.
2. The populations of the two main Island towns, Douglas and Ramsey, grew at a steady rate of around 6%, but the increase in Ramsey (and subsequent decline in Lezayre) was at least partly due to boundary changes. Of the other towns, Castletown's population fell by over 6% whereas Peel's experienced very little change. The populations of the four Island villages all increased, with the largest increases in the southern villages of Port Erin and Port St. Mary. The parishes all showed modest changes in population levels with the exceptions of Braddan and Lezayre. Recent residential development in Braddan led to its population rising by nearly one-quarter on its 1991 level. The population of Lezayre fell significantly, mainly due to boundary changes. The population of the Isle of Man is becoming denser in the eastern districts of Douglas, Onchan and Braddan, which now account for 48.3% of the total population compared to 46.9% in 1991.
3. The rate of increase in household formation continues to outstrip growth in the general household population, with the number of households increasing by 7.5%. Average household size has therefore fallen again, from 2.49 persons per household in 1991 to 2.38 in 1996. This is substantially due to the increase in one person households, which have increased by nearly 16% over the five years. Over 86% of householders live in houses or bungalows and just under 14% live in flats or maisonettes, representing little change on 1991. There are now more households with at least one person economically active (68.7% in 1996 compared to 66.3% in 1991).
4. The broad age structure of the population has changed over the five-year period, with the number of those of retirement age falling and the number of children and the number of people of working age increasing, as anticipated in Government population projections. This has had the effect of again reducing the Island's dependency ratio from 68.3% in 1991 to 65.7% in 1996. The dependency ratio has now fallen by over 20 percentage points in the last 20 years. The population tends to be younger than the average age (40 years old) in the east and west of the Island and older in the north (particularly) and south.
5. The proportion of the total population born in the Isle of Man increased for the first time since 1961, rising by 0.3 percentage points on its 1991 level to stand at 49.9%. A further 10.2% of those born outside the Isle of Man have Manx born parents. Just over 60% of the Manx born have UK parents or grandparents.
6. The number of residents employed on the Island is at a record 33,577. One of the significant post-war demographic and economic changes has been the steady increase in women as a proportion of the labour force, from under 30% in 1951 to nearly 45% in 1996. The largest occupational groups for men and women are:



Men are far more likely than women to be in full-time employment or self-employed, whereas women are far more likely than men to be working part-time. Men make up nearly 60% of all full-time occupations and account for nearly 80% of all self-employed occupations. Women account for nearly 90% of all part-time occupations.


- In terms of number of employees, the traditional industries of agriculture, forestry and fishing and tourism have continued to decline, but the manufacturing sector showed a slight increase on 1991 levels. This increase and decline in the agriculture, forestry and fishing sector was partly due to a reclassification of some employment between the two sectors. Most employment growth occurred in the financial services sector, which now accounts for 17.7% of total employment in the Isle of Man. The largest industrial sector, with over 18% of all Manx employees, remains professional services.
- Unemployment on the Island is relatively low compared to the UK and other industrialised countries, but unemployment rates tend to be higher in the north of the Island.
- Men tend to be without work because they are in education or retirement. For women, it is mainly because they are retired or looking after the home or family. Despite economic changes generally leading to more equality between the sexes, women are nearly forty times more likely than men to be without work because they are looking after the home or family.

ISLE OF MAN CENSUS AND RESIDENT POPULATIONS 1951-96

















NUMBER OF PRIVATE HOUSEHOLDS AND AVERAGE HOUSEHOLD SIZE 1961-96


