Manx Nature Conservation Forum Terms of Reference

Background

This forum was originally proposed when Mr Henderson was Minister and was "launched" at a meeting at the Manx Museum.

The initiation of the Forum was announced by Minister Gawne in his conservation policy speech on World Wetlands Day - 2nd February 2009: "A Conservation Forum, with representation from all conservation and countryside groups will be able to consider the future for biodiversity including the impacts of our changing climate. I'd like to discuss with the Manx Wildlife Trust and with other Non-Government Organisations (NGOs), how this might work – and what you would like to achieve through such a forum. It'll be a chance to lobby through a regular mechanism – which I hope will give more focus and develop our collective ability to preserve biodiversity on the Island."

Purpose of the Forum:

1. Dialogue

- An opportunity for NGOs to hear about and comment on DAFF's policies and priorities.
- A focus for DAFF's consultation with wildlife and countryside NGOs.
- An opportunity for DAFF to hear and comment on conservation and countryside groups' wildlife conservation priorities.
- An opportunity for groups to discuss common areas of interest.
- A body through which other sectors can discuss issues or matters with countryside groups.

Note: The Forum is not the sole route for the communication between DAFF and the NGOs.

2. Partnership of Government and Non-Government Organisations

- Extending joint working to better progress biodiversity conservation on the Island, especially Convention on Biological Diversity work.
- Initiating further joint projects.

3. Promotion of biodiversity conservation

More effective promotion and publicity of conservation issues.

4. Dissemination of scientific information

- Encouraging the sharing of scientific information and facilitating regular science updates.
- To assess what stage the Island is at with regard to wildlife conservation then to set targets and regularly report to the public on the progress made to meet those targets.
