Application for Consent to Remove Material from a Riverbed

Please Note: This application **does not** give consent to remove material from a riverbed. Consent must be issued **before** works commence.

Under Section 18 of the Fisheries Act 2012, consent must be obtained from DEFA prior to removing material from the bed of any river. River in this instance is defined as 'any natural or artificial channel through which water flows and includes a tributary or stream'. Material includes (but is not limited to) gravels, cobbles, boulders and soft sediment such as silt but does not include vegetation removed for the purpose of routine drainage management.
