



Shipping forecast for the North Irish Sea

Valid for 24 Hours

Issued on Wednesday, 14 January 2026 at 4:15pm by Ronaldsway Met Office

Warnings: Strong winds.
Synopsis: Low pressure in the mid-Atlantic driving associated fronts across the British Isles.
Wind: South or south-southwest 6 or 7, decreasing 5 or 6 later this evening or early tonight, then veering southwest overnight, decreasing 4 or 5 tomorrow morning, backing south 3 or 4 later.
State of Sea: Moderate or rough, falling mainly moderate overnight, then slight or moderate tomorrow morning, becoming slight later.
Weather: Occasional rain becoming mainly fair overnight.
Visibility: Good, occasionally moderate or poor in the rain.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Wind: South or southwest 3 or 4, becoming south or southeast 4 or 5, occasionally 6, overnight into Friday.
State of Sea: Slight or moderate.
Weather: Mainly fair, then outbreaks of rain or showers developing overnight.
Visibility: Mostly good, occasionally moderate in rain or showers.
