



Shipping forecast for the North Irish Sea

Warnings: Strong wind
Synopsis: A deep low developing west of Ireland will move north
Wind: South to southwest 4 or 5 but southeast in the east, decreasing 3 or 4 in west for a time overnight. Increasing south to southeast 5 or 6 during tomorrow morning, then increasing 6 or 7 in the west for a time tomorrow afternoon
State of Sea: Slight or moderate, becoming rough in the west for a time during tomorrow afternoon.
Weather: Mainly fair
Visibility: Mainly good

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Wind: South to southeast 5 or 6 but 4 at times around Liverpool Bay, veering southwest 3 or 4 from the west during Sunday afternoon
State of Sea: Slight or moderate, becoming slight during Sunday afternoon
Weather: Mainly fair at first, rain will develop on Sunday
Visibility: Good, occasionally moderate or poor in rain later
