



Shipping forecast for the North Irish Sea

Valid for 24 Hours

Issued on Tuesday, 15 July 2025 at 4:10pm by Ronaldsway Met Office

Warnings: Strong winds.

Synopsis: Low pressure and associated frontal zone continuing to move east across the British Isles.

Wind: Southwest 5 or 6, veering west-northwest 4 or 5 this evening but still occasionally 6 in Liverpool Bay. Veering northwest 4 or 5 by dawn tomorrow then decreasing 2 or 3 later tomorrow morning and becoming variable in the afternoon.

State of Sea: Moderate gradually becoming slight.

Weather: Rain in the north at first, clearing to occasional showers, then mainly fair later.

Visibility: Good, but moderate or poor in rain.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

Wind: Variable 3 or less, settling southeast tomorrow evening increasing 3 or 4 overnight into Thursday then increasing south 4 or 5 on Thursday afternoon.

State of Sea: Slight.

Weather: Mainly fair, then occasional rain or drizzle with areas of mist and isolated fog patches later.

Visibility: Good, becoming moderate or poor and very poor in fog patches.
