



Shipping forecast for the North Irish Sea

- Warnings:** Strong winds.
Synopsis: An Atlantic low moving northeast, then north, will drive frontal troughs east across the British Isles on Wednesday.
Wind: South or southeast force 2 or 3 increasing 4 or 5 overnight, locally 6 in the west. Veering southwest 5 or 6 by mid-morning Wednesday, easing 4 or 5, occasionally 6 during afternoon.
State of Sea: Smooth or slight, becoming slight or moderate.
Weather: Fair at first, then with rain spreading from the west late tonight into Wednesday morning before fair weather returns during the late morning and early afternoon.
Visibility: Good, becoming moderate, occasionally poor, in rain.

Outlook for the following 24 hours:

- Wind:** Southwest force 5 or 6 easing 4 or 5 later on Thursday.
State of Sea: Mainly moderate becoming slight or moderate.
Weather: Isolated showers.
Visibility: Mainly good.
